#### Council briefs

### No more all-ways stops planned for Argyll Rd.

ouncil recently approved a staff report recommending no more all-way stop signs be posted on Argyll Rd. between Mountainview Rd. and Miller Dr.

However, council did agree that Halton Police should be requested to step up its enforcement of the area. The request for more controlled intersections came from residents complaining about speeding and illegal passing stopped school buses.

Staff is also reluctant to post yet another community safety zone in Halton Hills until the two pilot sites here have been evaluated. There are currently four zones in Halton Hills.

The staff report stated that all-way stops have not proven to be an effective deterrent against speeding, and in fact increase noise and pollution, provide a false sense

of security and there is a high rate of disobedience.

#### Truck traffic banned

Council rushed approval of Councillor Kevin Kuiack's motion to ban heavy truck traffic on Fourth Line between 17 Sideroad and 10 Sideroad. Kuiack had wanted truck traffic banned on 10 Sideroad as well, but staff pointed out there are businesses on that road which may require truck service. Staff will study the 10 Sideroad decision.

Kuiack, who wanted the rushed approval because he would be absent at the subsequent council meeting, said residents have been complaining of gravel trucks on the Fourth Line, and damaging the newly resurfaced road.

In September, a resident delegation with a 100-name petition, came to council requesting action. At that time council voted that the matter be turned over to the engineering department for a report.
