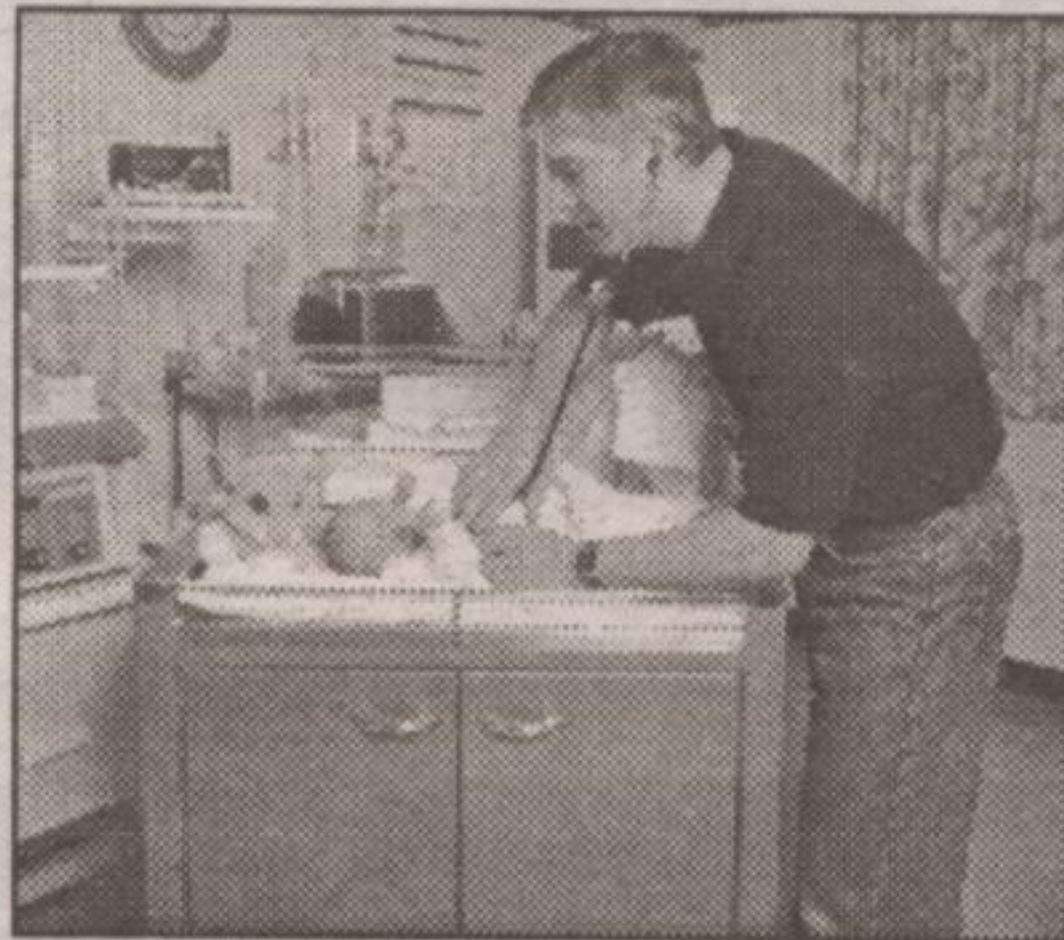

NOTICE OF COMPLETION GEORGETOWN WATER PURIFICATION PLANT IMPROVEMENTS CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The Regional Municipality of Halton proposes to install a filtration process at the Georgetown Water Purification Plant to address coloured water problems in the water distribution system. The addition of filtration at this site will involve the construction of a new building to house the filters and auxiliary equipment, including facilities to dispose of waste wash-water that would be produced during backwashing of the proposed filters.

This project has been carried out in accordance with Schedule 'B' of the Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for Municipal Water and Wastewater Projects. Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Regional Municipality of Halton proposes to proceed with the design and construction of this project for completion by early 2002.

Interested persons should provide written comments to J. A. MacDonald, Special Studies Engineer, at the Regional Municipality of Halton by **December 13, 2000**. If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussion with the Region, a person may request that the Minister of the Environment "bump up" this project to a Schedule 'C' Class EA or an Individual EA.

Requests to change the status of this project must be received by the Minister at the address below by **December 13, 2000** with a copy sent to the Regional Municipality of Halton Clerk. If, by **December 13, 2000**, there are no requests to "bump up" this project, the Regional Municipality of Halton will proceed with the project as outlined in the project report.
