It's Mayor Gastle!

Ward 2 councillor defeats Marilyn Serjeantson by 500 votes

Tith a 36 per cent voter turnout, Kathy Gastle won the job as the next mayor of Halton Hills in Monday's 2000 municipal election.

The Ward 2 councillor defeated incumbent Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson who held the job since 1994.

Gastle led Serjeantson the entire night with the final (unofficial) count being a 500-vote margin: Gastle: 6,016, Serjeantson, 5,516. Third mayoralty candidate Robert Heaton was a distant third at 1,509.

"I feel great," said an excited Gastle, the former Ward 2 councillor, Monday night. "I am grateful to the many constituents of Acton, Georgetown and Esquesing for their confidence in selecting me mayor for Halton Hills. I'm really looking forward to working with the new council and establishing a new level of excellence."

Gastle said she had always felt positive during the campaign. "I think people were looking for more vision for the town and stronger leadership and that's what I ran my campaign on."

She said felt her messages of bringing

more industrial growth to the town and preserving the small town quality of Halton Hills resonated with the voters.

Top priorities for Gastle in the next three years will be economic development such as finding more industrial land, solving town transportation problems, and ensuring that during the Official Plan review there are policies and protections in place to manage growth and the environment in a positive way.

Gastle celebrated her victory with wellwishers packing St. Paul's Hall in Norval, and did not come to the Civic Centre to acknowledge the results as most of the other candidates did.


A dejected Serjeantson, surrounded by family members, came to the Civic Centre shortly after 10 p.m. to offer her congratulations to the new mayor, but was left waiting and eventually conceded her job to Gastle via a phone conversation.

"Congratulations Kathy, you ran a good campaign," Serjeantson told Gastle. "I know you will enjoy being mayor, I did."


