Deadline nears for United Way raffle

There will also be secondary prizes of a weekend for two at Windermere House in Muskoka and a three-piece set of luggage.

Tickets for the draw are available at various outlets in both Georgetown and Acton or by calling the United Way office at 877-3066. A booth will also be set up in the Georgetown Marketplace this week, Nov. 13-18.

Tickets will also be available for the Caribbean-themed draw evening, to be host-

ed by Don Daynard, formerly of CHFI. It will also take place Saturday, Nov. 25 at 7:30 p.m. at the Georgetown Golf Club. Sparky's D.J. will provide the music of your favourite oldies. Tickets are \$15 and there will be door prizes.


The raffle is one way in which the United Way of Halton Hills is working toward its goal of \$250,000. That money will be used to fund programs for its 18 member agencies.

It is also working toward that goal through its direct mail campaign. This is the second year the organization has used the direct mail campaign. Donation forms have been mailed to 17,447 homes in Halton Hills.

"It's been very good but we still need more donations. We're down from last year," said executive director Brenda Smith. "We're sending out a second mailing so we hope people give more generously."
