Minor Novice Raiders

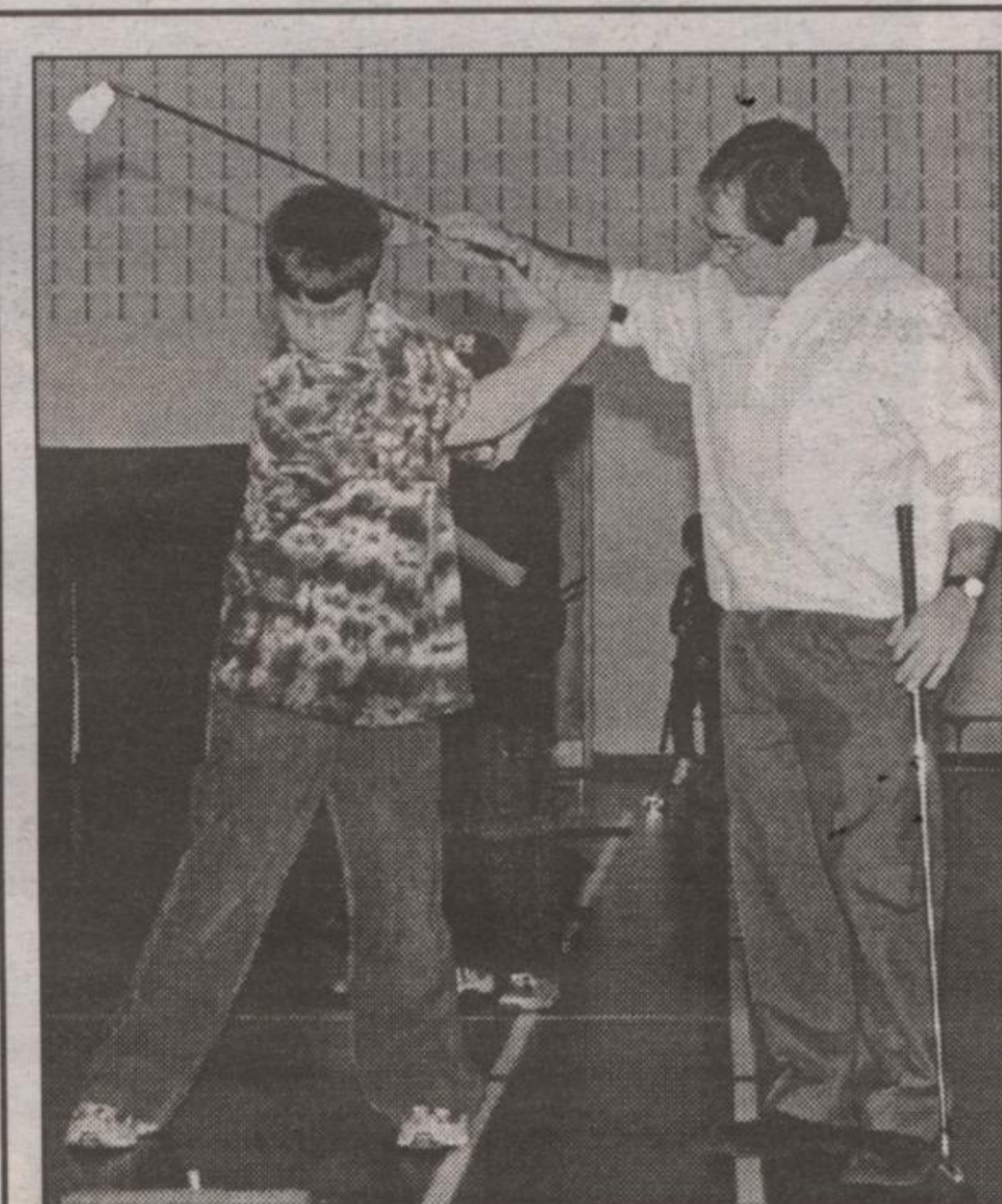
Jesse Simonsen scored once and set up another in the Chalmers Esso Fuels Raiders' 6-3 loss to Oakville.
