New mayor Kathy Gastle won every ward

Municipal election polling went smoothly

Toting at the polls, and counting afterwards, went smoothly during Monday night's election, said town clerk Karen Landry.

Landry said everything went well and the only minor headache for some polling supervisors occurred when some voters presented their federal election voter's card, instead of their municipal card, at the polling stations.

In those cases, the voters voted if they presented identification, or if they were at the wrong poll, were directed to the correct poll.

Vote counts are now officially certified with a total voter turnout of 39.2 per cent, up from the 1997 election turnout of 36.8 per cent. A review of the poll votes for the mayoralty race showed that Ward 2 Councillor Kathy Gastle defeated incumbent Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson in every ward:

• Ward 1: Kathy Gastle, 988; Marilyn Serjeantson, 954; Robert Heaton, 185

• Ward 2: Gastle, 1,440; Ser-

jeantson, 1,291; Heaton, 507

• Ward 3: Gastle, 1,517; Serjeantson, 1,295; Heaton, 351

• Ward 4: Gastle, 2,071; Serjeantson, 1,976; Heaton, 465.

Voter turnout in Ward 1 was 38.5 per cent; in Ward 2, 38 per cent; in Ward 3, 38.6 per cent and in Ward 4, 40.8 per cent.

The final council meeting for the 1997-2000 term council will be Monday, Nov. 27— the night of the federal election. Council will be saying goodbye to three members— Serjeantson, and Ward 2 Councillor Kevin Kuiack who both lost in Monday's election, and to retiring Ward 1 Councillor Norm Elliott.

Facility site chosen

A new site was recently selected in Oakville for Halton Region's new long-term care facility.

The new facility will incorporate 100 beds taken from Martin House in Milton, as well as 128 new beds awarded by the province. Both facilities are open to all Halton residents.

Just over four acres of land has been chosen on the north side of Georgian Road in Oakville. That's located in the town's core, south of Regional Road Five, between Sixth Line and Trafalgar Road.

When the Oakville facility is up and running, current Martin House residents will have the choice of staying in Milton or heading south. The idea is to bring residents closer to their loved ones.




