

Over 120 vendors to attend Huttonville antique/craft show

The Huttonville Lions Antique & Craft Show, which has become one of the best known of its type, will be held this weekend (Nov. 25 and Nov. 26).

Held twice a year, the show features 120 antique and craft vendors who display their merchandise throughout the classrooms, gymnasium and hallways of the Huttonville Community School, located on Embleton Rd. More than 4,000 people regularly attend the show— some from as far away as Windsor.

At only 14 members strong, the Huttonville Lions Club is the smallest Lions Club in the area, but one of the most active. The club raises almost \$50,000 annually, through its craft shows and bingo sponsorship. In turn these monies support more than 20 community groups including the school, local scout groups, area hospital projects, Camp Dorset and Camp Trillium.

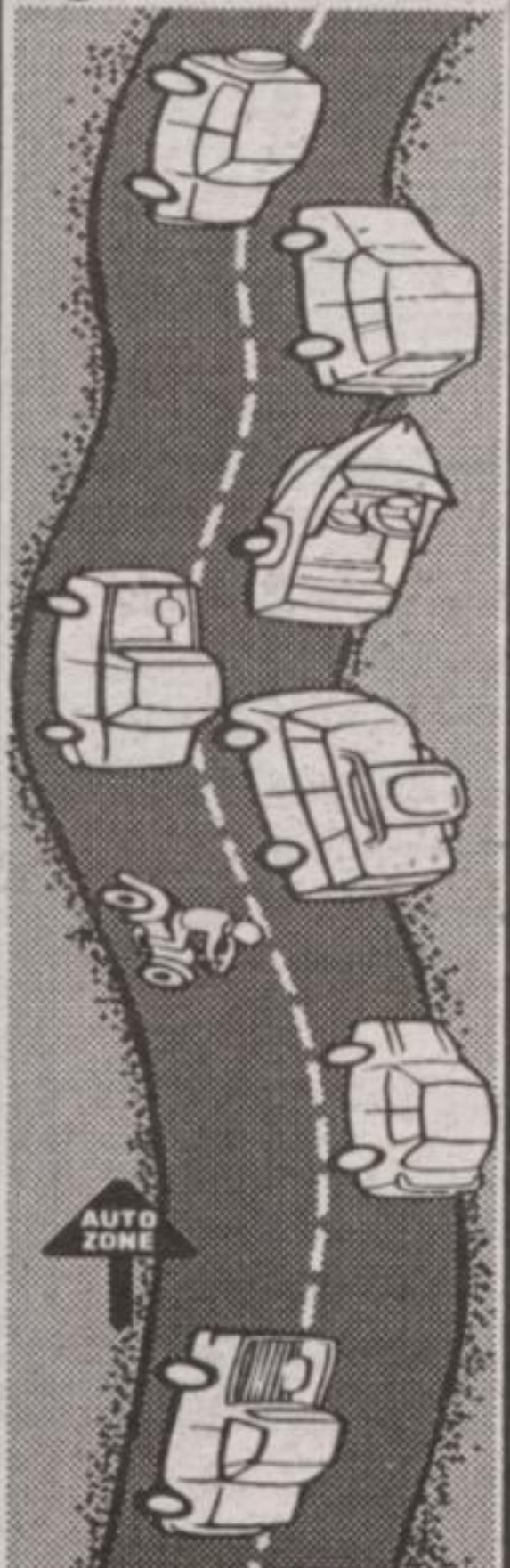
