

The Acton Red Storm's bid for a third straight Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) tournament berth came to a heart-breaking end.

Acton suffered a three-game loss to Mississauga's St. Paul's last Tuesday ending the senior boys volleyball season. Acton stormed out of the gate taking the opening game easily 25-16.
