## Lack of attack sinks Acton squad

It was a trial by fire for Acton's senior girls basketball team. The recently merged -junior and senior squads were playing together for the first time as they headed into Wednesday's qualifier for the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) A tournament. Acton had hoped for some early game action with the combined team but it's first qualifier was canceled.

That sent them up against Queensway Christian, which had qualified for four consecutive OFSAA tournaments, and the result was a 39-7 loss.

Acton did a good job of containing Queensway in the early going, allowing only two points in the first five minutes. But as Queensway got more aggressive, they forced turnovers and built a 9-2 lead.

Acton again adjusted at the end of the half, allowing just two points over the last four minutes of the half but by that time were down 18-4.

"We burned a lot of energy breaking their presses," said coach Jamie Shepherd. "Each time we did they went to a different press. We were just playing catch up."

Acton did a better job of mounting some offence in the second half but couldn't get the shots to drop.

Despite the loss, Acton will still get to participate in the OFSAA tournament in Sturgeon Falls. The tournament begins next Wednesday.

"The goal will be to win a game," Shepherd said. "It will be a good experience for these girls, though."
