Georgetown cancer office will officially close Friday

The Georgetown office of the Canadian Cancer Society will close its door for the last time this Friday, Dec. 1.

The Canadian Cancer Society (CCS) will now provide services and support to north Halton residents through offices located in Guelph, Brampton, Burlington or Oakville. These offices operate on full-time hours compared to the Georgetown office which

was manned only part-time.

The impending closure of the office prompted local volunteers in October to splinter off into a new, locally-run, group called the Cancer Assistance Service (CAS) of Halton Hills. This group, which is not associated with the Cancer Society, plans to run patient services such as transportation, emotional support groups, and preventative education programs.
