It's a no-GO for expanded service

rea commuters will likely have to wait several years before addi-L tional peak-hour GO trains are added on the Georgetown line.

A recent report in a Toronto daily newspaper stated GO was planning to expand its peak service to nine trains and add allday service on the Georgetown route in the near future.

However, Karen Majerly, GO Transit information officer, said that information was incorrect.


She said the addition to nine peak service trains and all-day service on the line are in GO's long-range plans— more than 10 to 20 years in the future.


Majerly said sometime within 10 years GO hopes to add two additional peak-hour trains on the line, bringing the total to seven (four trains currently go to Union Station and one to Bramalea). But that will only occur after about \$35 million is spent on infrastructure improvements, including the addition of a second track.

"The demand is not there for all-day service," said Majerly. "For peak periods the demand is there now."

GO chair Eldred King recently said a proposed rail link to the airport from Union Station along the Georgetown corridor can't operate on the same lines because the added traffic would impede GO ser-

"Our number one priority is protecting GO train service on that line," said Majerly. —By Lisa Tallyn, staff writer




