STRIDE gets \$70,000 grant

STRIDE (Supported Training and Rehabilitation in Diverse Environments) has been awarded a \$70,000 grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation.

STRIDE is a community-based vocational rehabilitation program which has operated for 18 years to improve the employability and work readiness of those with mental health illnesses.

The organization will use the money to buy two passenger vans. One will replace the van currently being used to transport clients living throughout Halton Hills and Milton to the training site in Acton.

The second van will increase STRIDE's ability to provide full range employment opportunities such as temporary work placements, work initiatives and delivery of packaging and assembly jobs to its work sites in Acton, Oakville and Burlington.

The Ontario Trillium Foundation is a provincial agency which collects funds from Ontario's charity gaming ventures and divvies it up among arts, recreation and social service sectors.
