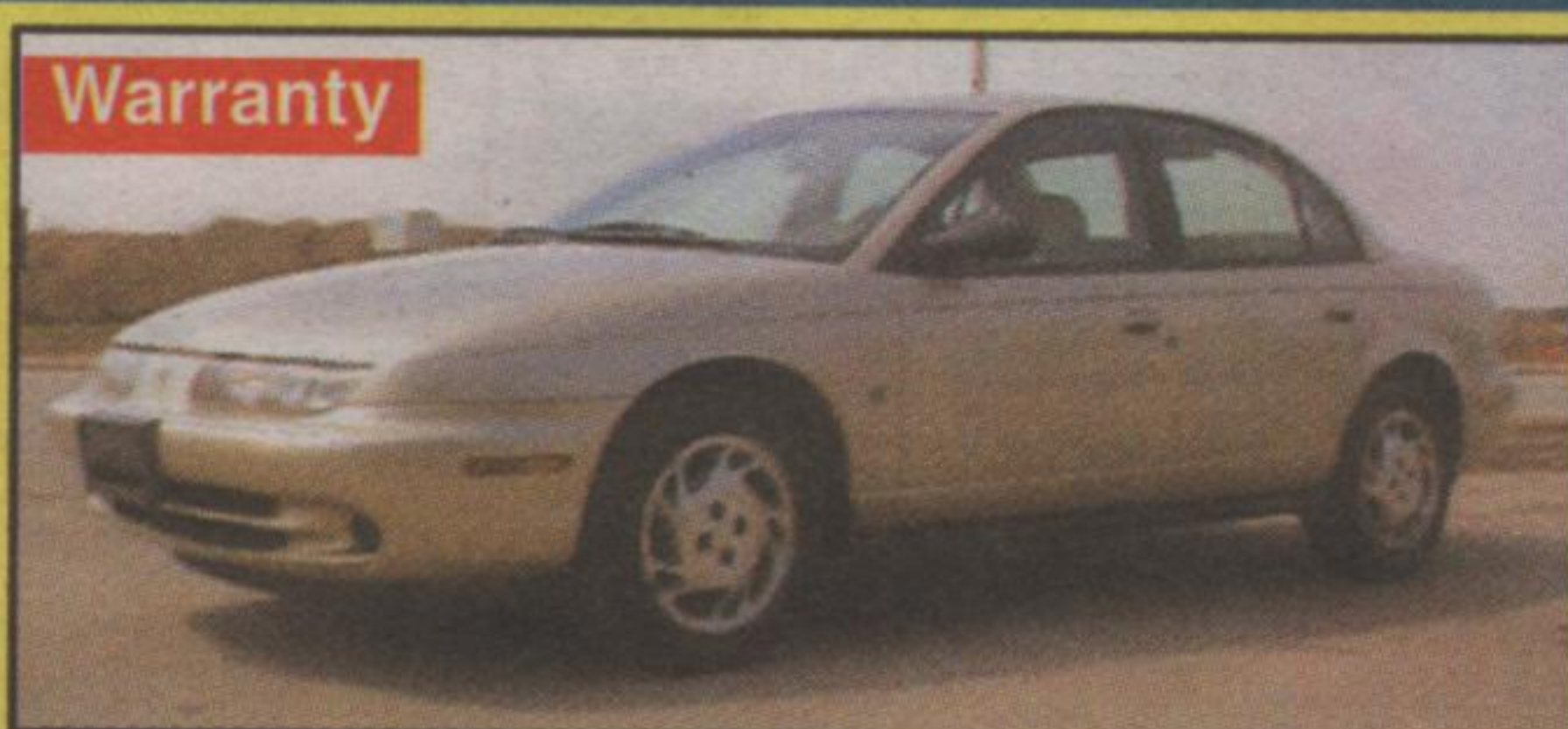

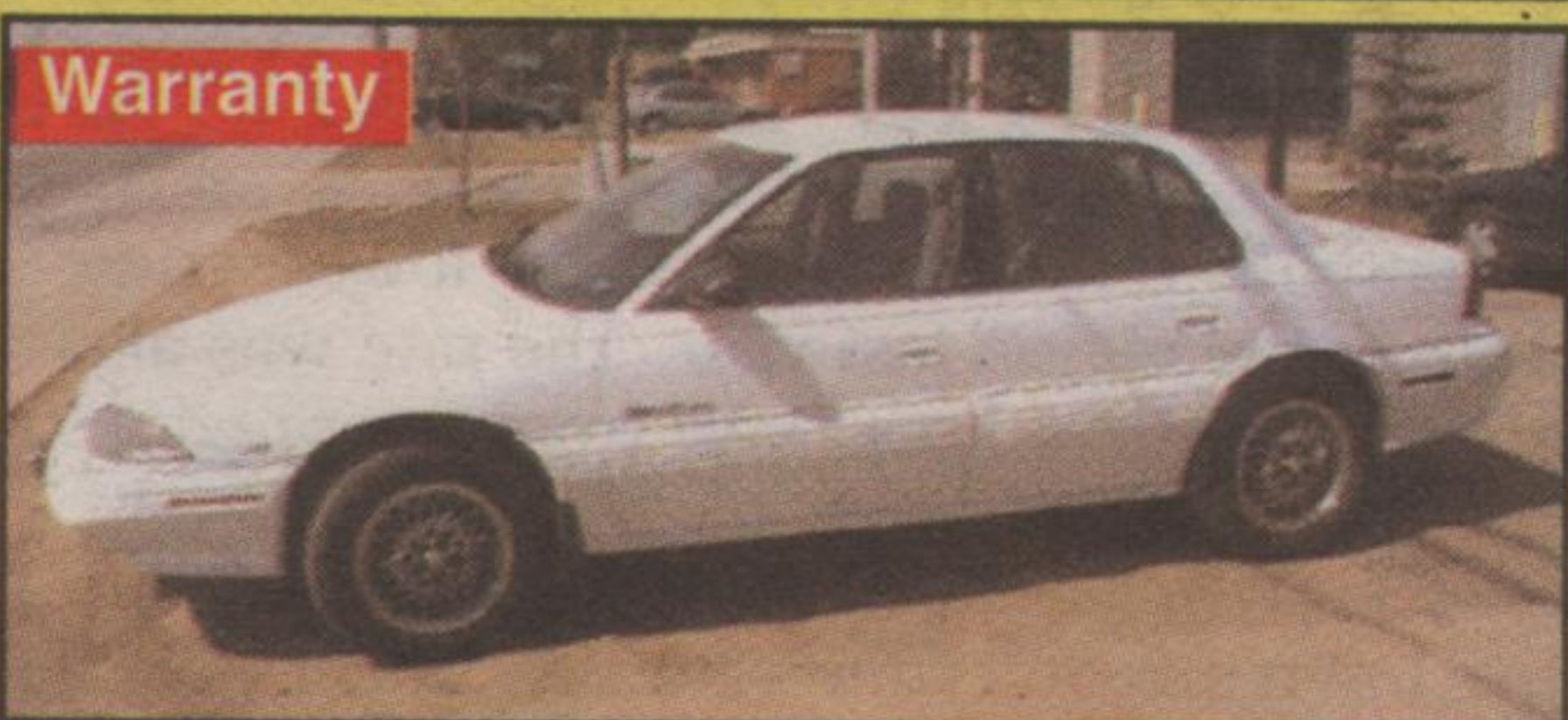

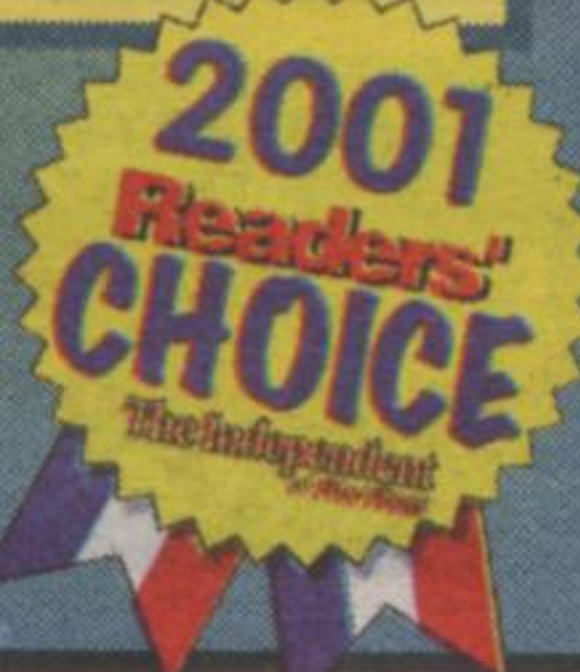

Magna still undecided if Acton will get plant

Magna International hasn't decided yet if it will build an auto parts plant in Acton.

"It still hasn't been decided," said Blake Hossack of MI Developments Inc., Magna's real estate arm. "It's a complicated process."

Hossack said he thought there would have been a decision by now, and it's hard to say when one will be made.

He said Magna has extended the option to purchase the Acton property. Town CAO Steve Andrews said he believes that option would expire sometime next week.

Hossack stressed Magna is considering a number of locations for the plant but would not comment on them.

Andrews said he understood Magna is also considering its current Milton location.

Hossack said the only reason Magna "went public" on the Acton location is because they had to rezone the property.

"Everyone is still in the running," said Hossack.

Andrews said the town is currently working with Credit Valley Conservation on the issue of the environmentally sensitive area along the southern lot line of the property.

"As far as we're concerned there are no barriers to developing the site," said Andrews.
