Police nab man wanted for attempted murder

Halton Regional Police got more than they bargained for when they stopped a driver for speeding Tuesday morning.

About 7:20 a.m., police were running radar on Guelph St. at Sinclair Ave. as part of Project Gateway. After pulling over the driver, and running a check on him, police found there was an outstanding warrant for the arrest of

the man for attempt murder and use of a firearm.

The man, Hoy Dong Tran, 26, of Toronto has been charged in connection with a shooting at an Ossington Ave. Toronto karaoke bar earlier this year.

Halton officers apprehended the man without incident and turned him over to Metro Police.

Halton super earns honour

A Halton superintendent has been honoured as Ontario's top education administrator.

There are several criteria for the award, which recognizes outstanding achievement by a school administrator:


Community involvement

Under the awards program, an outstanding education administrator is chosen for both Ontario and western New York.




NOTICE OF STREET NAME CHANGE


