


NOTICE OF STREET NAME CHANGE

NOTICE is hereby given that Council for the Town of Halton Hills will be considering the passage of a Bylaw to authorize changing the name of the following street from Princess Anne Drive to Halton Hills Drive at its meeting to be held on Monday, May 7, 2001 at 7:30 p.m. The meeting will be held in the Council Chamber in the Civic Centre, 1 Halton Hills Drive, Georgetown.

That part of Princess Anne Drive lying between Maple Avenue and Halton Hills Drive, being Parts 1 and 6 on Reference Plan 20R-9090, in the Town of Halton Hills and shown in the sketch below.

Council shall hear any person who claims to be prejudicially affected by the By-law and who applies to be heard. Persons wishing to be heard should notify the Clerk's Department prior to the meeting date.

You are invited to participate in a Community Meeting to examine and discuss a proposal to: designate a portion of the Hamlet of Glen Williams as a Heritage Conservation District under the Ontario Heritage Act, and adopt a Glen Williams Heritage Conservation District Plan. The Hamlet of Glen Williams is located north of the Georgetown urban area.

The purpose of the proposed Heritage Conservation District (HCD) and HCD Plan is to provide a basis for protection of the heritage resources of the district. At the meeting, the public will have an opportunity to ask questions regarding various concerns related to the proposed Heritage Conservation District and HCD Plan. Town staff have obtained information and invited people knowledgeable about the various concerns

Copies of the draft Glen Williams Heritage Conservation District Plan, and associated draft by-laws are available for public review and comment in the Town of Halton Hills Planning Department.

- Halton's staff are highly qualified, licensed and are dedicated to delivering safe drinking water



If you have been looking for specific information about your drinking water, Halton Region's Quarterly Water Quality Report will provide you with the information you need.

The report details information about where your water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to the Provincial Standards. If your drinking water comes from a private well, you are responsible for your water's safety. Halton's website provides links to the Halton Region Health Department and the Ministry of the Environment regarding the maintenance and safety of your private well supply.

The Water Quality Report can be obtained free of charge by:

- Downloading it from the Internet at Halton's website, www.region.halton.on.ca;
- Picking up a copy in person during normal business hours (Monday to Friday, 8:30 to 4:30) at the Regional Municipality of Halton (Planning & Public Works Department), Records & Information Management Section, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville; or
