The event, sponsored by POWER (Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources) and the Hickory Falls Ratepayers Association (HFRA), is a follow up to the highly successful winter meeting.

Event organizer Daphne Shropshall of the HFRA, says the meeting will serve as reminder to rural residents to get their well tested this spring. Halton Region's hydrogeologist Steve Holysh will

explain to residents about Halton's new acquifer management program which will establish among other things four development zones circling the the municipal well locations— the closer a rural property is to a well, the tighter the land use restrictions.

As well there will be a discussion on the pros and cons of Halton Region's rural sludging program. Panelists will be Peter Morden, Biosolids Recycling coordinator of Halton Region's environmental services and Cary Shinn of the Safe Sewage Coalition.
