Good road trip ends on a downer Lightning strikes Bulldogs

The Akwesasne Lightning spoiled the Halton Hills Bulldogs bid for a perfect road trip.

The Bulldogs won the first two games of their three-game journey, downing Guelph 16-10 Thursday and Kahnawake 18-11 Saturday. Looking for the sweep on Sunday, the Bulldogs couldn't overcome a 4-0 first period deficit on their way to 15-10 loss.

"We dominated the first period but we were snakebit," said Bulldog GM Mike Hancock. "We had about 20 shots but their goalie made some good saves and once we figured out we had to shoot low on him, we started to score."

"We're very happy that we got three strong games, though."

The Bulldogs now stand second in the Ontario Lacrosse Association Jr. B West Central Division with a 3-2-2 record.

It was a big weekend for the Bulldogs' John Derochie, who had nine goals in the three games, including a four-goal effort in the loss to Akwesasne. That boosted his goal total to 14 for the season, just one behind team leader Mike Dube. Dube had his six-game goal-scoring streak snapped against the Lightning.

Dube had three goals and five points as the Bulldogs overcame an early 6-4 deficit against Guelph. Derochie also had a hat-trick in that game but it was Scott Aitken, the Bulldogs' top goal scorer last season, who broke out by netting four. Tyler Phillips and Daryl Veltman each scored twice.

The Bulldogs used an eight-goal third period to break open a 10-9 game against Kahnawake. Ryan Busby scored three times—twice in the final 10 minutes—and Brad Marshall had two goals and two assists. B.J.

Brown, Derochie, Dube and Richard Haan each scored twice.

DOG BITES: The Bulldogs have an 11-day break before playing three games in four days. Their next game is at Memorial Arena Thursday, May 24 at 8 p.m. against Spartan. 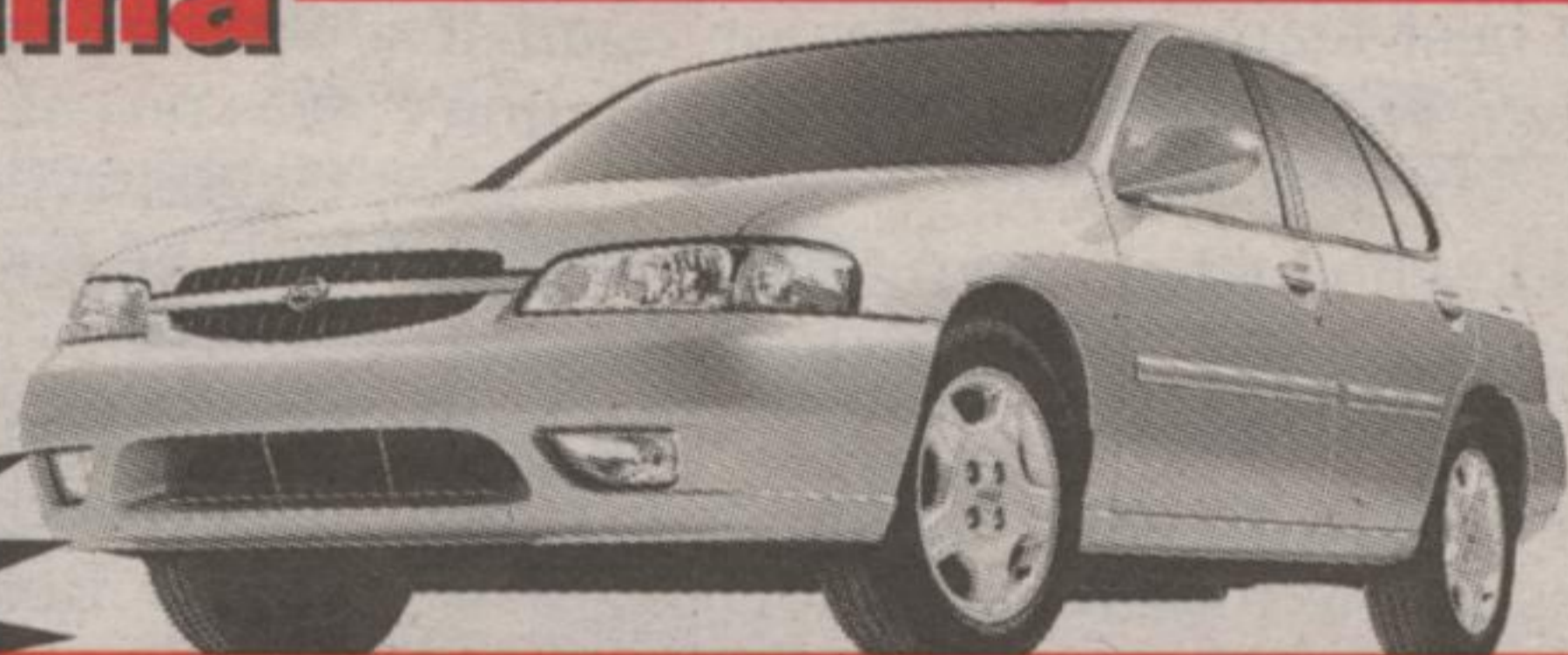
