

Local couple, German pair face charges

local man has been charged in connection 1 with the purchase of more than \$10,000 worth of computer equipment over the Internet using unauthorized credit cards.

Halton Police arrested a man Thursday outside a Milton business after he identified himself as the person who made the on-line Internet purchases.

Charged with fraud over \$5,000, fraud under \$5,000, possession of a forged passport and personation is Thomas Schulz, 41, of 25 Sideroad, Halton Hills. The identity of the man is still under investigation as police believe he has used a number of fictitious names.

Further investigation by Halton Police resulted in the arrest Saturday of Donna Lee Garibaldi-Sanger, 31, Schulz's wife, who police say falsely identified herself as Julie Shulz.

She was charged with personation, false pretenses and utter forged documents.

Also charged with fraud over \$5,000 and fraud under \$5,000 in connection with the computer purchase is Bernhard Schwarzer, 54, of Berlin, Germany.

Police say Schwarzer and his wife Jutta Schwarzer, 58, also of Berlin, were arrested Thursday by Peel Police while attempting to board a plane to the U.S.

The couple were charged with fraud under \$5,000 in connection with the purchase of airline tickets using an unauthorized U.S. credit card.

Bernhard Schwarzer is also charged with cause use of a forged passport.

All four charged were held for bail hearings yesterday (Tuesday) in Milton court.
