

Sport 5-3-2 record

Bulldogs happy at halfway point

A s the Halton Hills Bulldogs look back on the first half of the season, they like what they see.

The team stands at 5-3-2 after winning twice on the weekend. That's good for a comfortable hold on second place in the Ontario Lacrosse Association's Central West Division.

But there's not much time for looking back. The Bulldogs know there is still much room to improve despite being on pace to tie the franchise's single-season points record.

"Before the weekend we were fourth in offence and 17th in defence," said Bulldogs coach Gerald Veltman. "That should tell you our weak points."

Veltman has been happy with the goaltending duo of Paul Edwards and Steve Wyshnicki but would like to reduce the number of quality shots the netminders have to face.

By doing that he believes they will be able to turn close games in victories. Already this season the Bulldogs have two ties and two one-goal losses— including Thursday's 12-11 loss to the Spartan Warriors.

"We had the momentum," Veltman said of the Bulldogs six-goal third period. "We just ran out of time."

Mike Dube had a hat-trick and Richard Haan, Jeff Hohendorf and John Derochie each scored twice against Spartan. Scott Aitken and Daryl Veltman added singles. Ryan Busby had three assists. The Bulldogs bounced back with a 7-6 win over Orangeville Saturday and a 10-8 victory against Sarnia Sunday in Acton.

Orangeville (2-10-1) gave the 'Dogs trouble for the second time this season with its tight defensive style. Haan and B.J. Brown each scored twice and Derochie, Tyler Phillips and Daryl Veltman each had one.

The 'Dogs found themselves in another tight game against Sarnia. They built an 8-5 lead with four second-period goals. However, Sarnia cut the lead to one before Andrew Brassard's second goal of the game with 1:33 to play sealed the victory.

Mike Dube also scored twice to hit the 20-goal mark, equaling the Bulldogs' top scorer from last season. Brown, Jason Armstrong, Phillips, Scott Aitken, Blair Beaulieu and Derochie had the other goals.

McGeer records sweep in Subaru rally series

"There was a big flat rock, with sharp edges on the edge

of the road and I cut the corner a bit too much and hit it," McGeer said.

"I couldn't believe I'd thrown the rally away."

McGeer drove the next six kilometres to the end of the stage on three wheels and fortunately the disintegrating tire did not damage the suspension. Meanwhile, Richard won the stage and the next one to cut McGeer's lead to 48 seconds

However, McGeer won the final stage to clinch his third victory in four starts this season. The win put McGeer and Williams in great position to repeat as Canadian rally champs. McGeer leads the series points race with 60 while Sylvain Erickson is sec-
