Student-written book on historical walking tour is selling well

the 42 Grade 5 students published authors.

The class has produced Walking Backwards: Historical Walking Tours of Georgetown, a 41-page book with four separate walking tours of the town.

The project got rolling as a class study on ancient civilization. To better understand other civilizations, the class took a look at their own. The class documented the town's history through their own walking tours, newspaper clippings and a meeting and story telling session with some longtime residents.

As the information was compiled, Park teacher Marg Davies started to think that it would be a shame not to share the information. In late April, the class decided to produce a book.

"There are so many wonderful stories," Davies said. "For people who are new to the town it's a great way to learn about the community."

With a parent, Dave Wright of Gemini Print Management Systems, donating the printing, the school had 1,000 copies printed. And so far, the book has been well received.

"I don't think a day passes that someone doesn't make a comment about the book," said Marg Davies. "Everyone is so impressed with what the kids have done."

The book, which costs \$5, is selling well with more than \$1,500 raised so far. The class made an initial donation of \$1,200 to the Georgetown hospital and will continue to donate the proceeds.

And the book has sparked memories among other residents. Davies said many people have approached her regarding stories of other buildings and plans for a second edition are being made.

"We've had a lot of favorable comments and contacts who want to tell the kids their

stories," Davies said.
