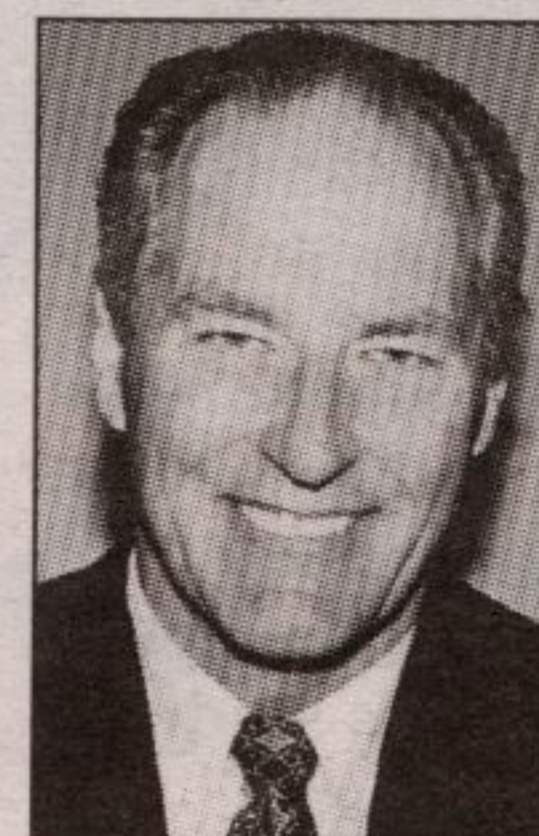
## MPP Chudleigh to meet with chemical/construction industries

Halton MPP Ted Chudleigh will be on the road this summer.

As parliamentary assistant to Bob Runciman, minister of Economic Development and Trade, Chudleigh will be meeting with representatives of chemical and construction companies.

"I'm trying to understand what government can do to help these key sectors of our economy," said Chudleigh. "If we can get ahead of the curve, and make necessary changes now, we can help these companies smooth out the economic cycle. That leads to more growth, more jobs and opportunity, and ultimately better living standards."

He's already met with companies in Sarnia's chemical valley, and is slated to do extensive consultations with companies located west and east of Toronto as well as northern Ontario.

"It's my goal to identify red tape, inter-provincial trade barriers, regulatory issues and other impediments to growth. At the end of the consultation process I will make recommendations to the minister," he explained.
