Arts Alive wants nominations for five community arts awards

Every five years Arts Alive, a group of volunteers promoting the arts community, accepts nominations for five special awards. These awards recognize members of the community who encourage and support visual and performing arts in Halton Hills.

Nomination forms are available at the John Elliott Theatre office or by calling 905-877-5545. The nomination deadline is Friday, Sept. 7.

There are five categories:

Ralph Ursel Award for Volunteerism: This award recognizes an individual who has volunteered extensively in artistic activities. The committee is looking for a well rounded individual, who has contributed for many years behind the scenes. The person is not necessarily an artist or performer themselves, but someone who works hard to ensure that others can achieve their creative potential.

The award is named after the late Ralph Ursel who was a very active volunteer in our community for many years.

Previous winners include John Sommer and Dorothy Hunt.

Kenneth R. Harrison Award: This award is named after a former Georgetown music teacher and choir leader. This winner is someone who has worked extensively with Halton Hills youth and who acts as a mentor for the artistic endeavours of local youth.

Previous award winners are Paul Brisley and Dale Wood.

Arts Alive Award for Patron of the Arts: This award recognizes a company or individual who supports a variety of artistic activities through their continued financial support.

Previous winners are Norma Elliott and Paul and Janet Armstrong.

Arts Alive Award for Visual Arts: Arts Alive is looking for a visual artist who creates in any medium—for example, painting, sculpting, stained glass, woodcarving.

Arts Alive will recognize someone who has displayed excellence in their craft, who has had a long career as an artist, with special consideration given to someone who also volunteers in the arts community.

Previous winners are Fran and Frank Anthony and Jacky Willows.

Arts Alive Award for Performing Arts: This award honours a longtime performer—an actor, singer, dancer or entertainer who has brought joy to local audiences over the years. Again, participation for a volunteer capacity is an added benefit.

The two previous winners are Ron Hunt and the late Ron Hill.

The awards ceremony will be held on Sunday, October 21 at a gala to be held in the Gallery at the Halton Hills Cultural Centre.

Winners will be presented with a bronze medallion that was commissioned by Arts Alive when the awards ceremonies began in 1991.
