



Veteran firefighter named second Deputy Fire Chief


ongtime Halton Hills Fire Department employee Brian Ellsworth was appointed as a second Deputy Fire Chief this week.

At Tuesday's meeting, council approved a new organiza-

tional structure for the town department, which created a second Deputy Fire Chief position to manage the fire prevention and public education section.

Last month, the town hired Larry Brassard as Deputy Fire Chief to replace the retiring Bob Hyde.

Ellsworth, a 11-year veteran, said "I am pleased to be part of a management team that is very proactive and quality customer service oriented."



He added in his new job he will strive to implement prevention, inspection and public education programs that will meet the fire and life safety requirements of every resident in Halton Hills.

"Our community, like those surrounding us, is undergo-" ing significant changes in terms of growth. This restructuring will allow the fire department to keep pace with the challenges that current and future growth will present to us," said Chief Bob Meads, who himself was appointed to the job earlier this year. "We want to be able to provide excellence in fire prevention and protection services while being responsive to the changing needs of our community."

The department operates two stations— one at Maple Ave. in Georgetown and the other at Churchill Rd. in Acton— and is staffed by 16 full-time and 80 part-time employees. In addition to emergency calls, the department also provides a full range of services including plans examination, inspection services, fire prevention, public education, communications, fire suppression, technical rescue, and hazardous materials response. Last year, the department responded to more than 500 calls.
