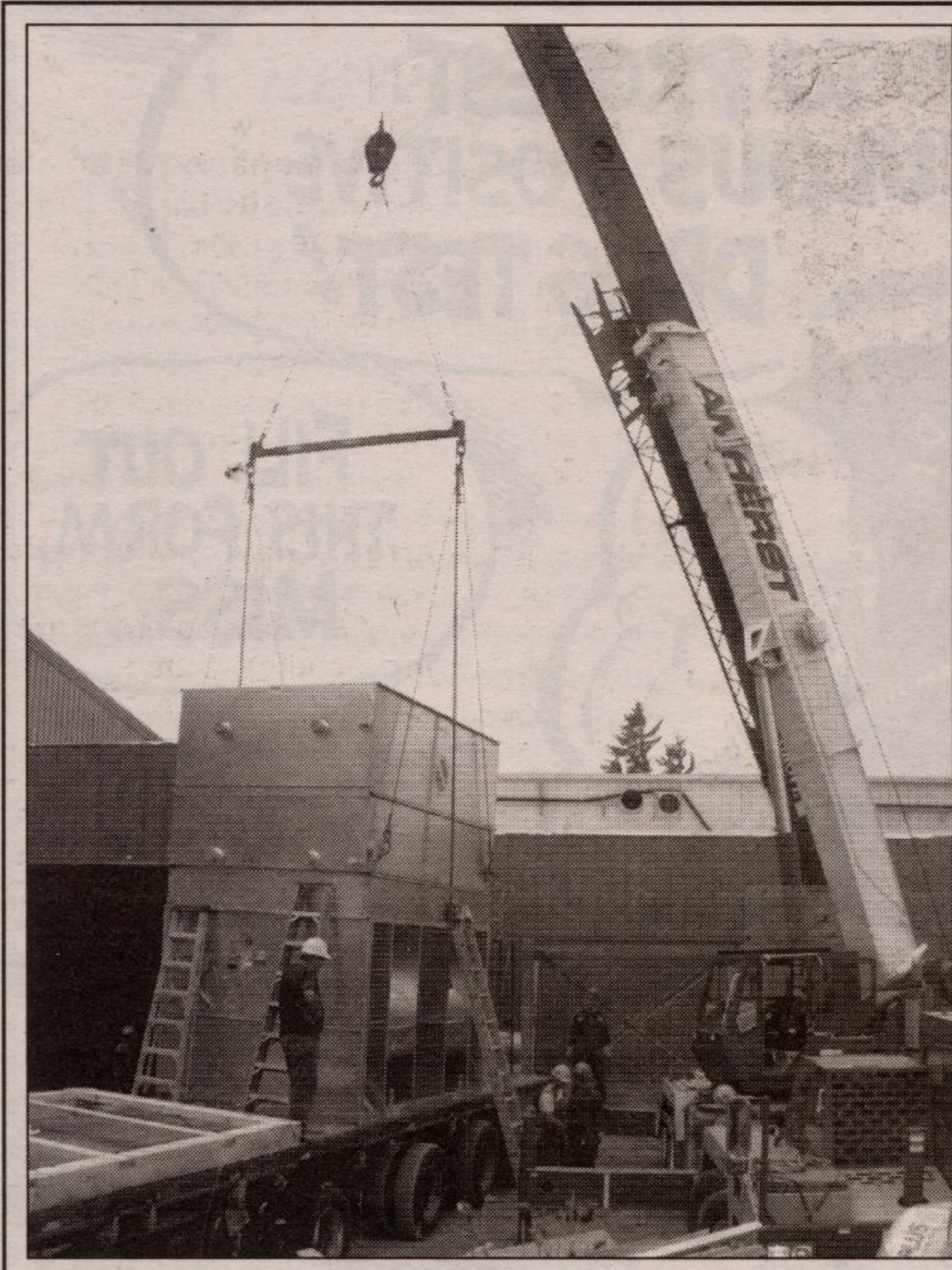


## The ice machine cometh

The refrigeration unit for the new Mold-Masters Sportsplex arena was set into place last Thursday after it was transported from Baltimore Aircoil. A crane was brought in to lift the top section from the tractor trailer, and set in on the bottom section. After it was assembled, the entire unit, weighing about 13,000 lbs., was lifted onto the stand at the back of the building. The refrigeration unit, which will be used for ice making, was constructed by Baltimore Aircoil, located on Sinclair Avenue in Georgetown.

## 'Hard-working' former councillor given Senior of the Year honour

Gerald Rennie of Acton was presented with the Ontario Senior of the Year Award at Tuesday's council meeting.

The former town councillor, teacher and minister, was nominated by Mayor Kathy Gastle for the award.

"It's wonderful that someone like (Rennie) is being presented with this award; someone who so justly deserves it," said Gastle, during a special presentation. "You are hardworking, dedicated, kind and so friendly to deal with... your many accomplishments in Halton Hills have not gone unnoticed."

The provincial Ministry of Citizenship award is given to "a senior who over the age of 65 has enriched the social, cultural and civic life of their community without thought of personal gain."

Beside 12 years spent representing Acton as a councillor, Rennie served "countless hours" on various community committees including the Acton Seniors Centre, Acton Business Improvement Association, Knox Church board, Halton Hills Logo Committee, Halton Hills Community Support and Information, Acton FoodShare, Acton Citizens Band, Halton Police's Community Consultation Committee and just recently the town's Council Remuneration Citizens Review Committee.

"I really think it's wonderful that you give me an opportunity to share this award with other people in town... and they're being recognized as well," said Rennie in his acceptance speech. "There are wonderful people in Halton Hills; many caring and selfless people who are prepared to work together to make a better community, and it's easy to work with people like that."

Halton Region chair Joyce Savoline told him that he is "one of the most genuine, real, good people, I have ever met... whenever there is a need you seem to come and quietly fill it, never expecting to have a thank you."

She called Rennie an inspiration and role model for this community and presented him with regional plaque recognizing his commitment and a coffee book on Halton.

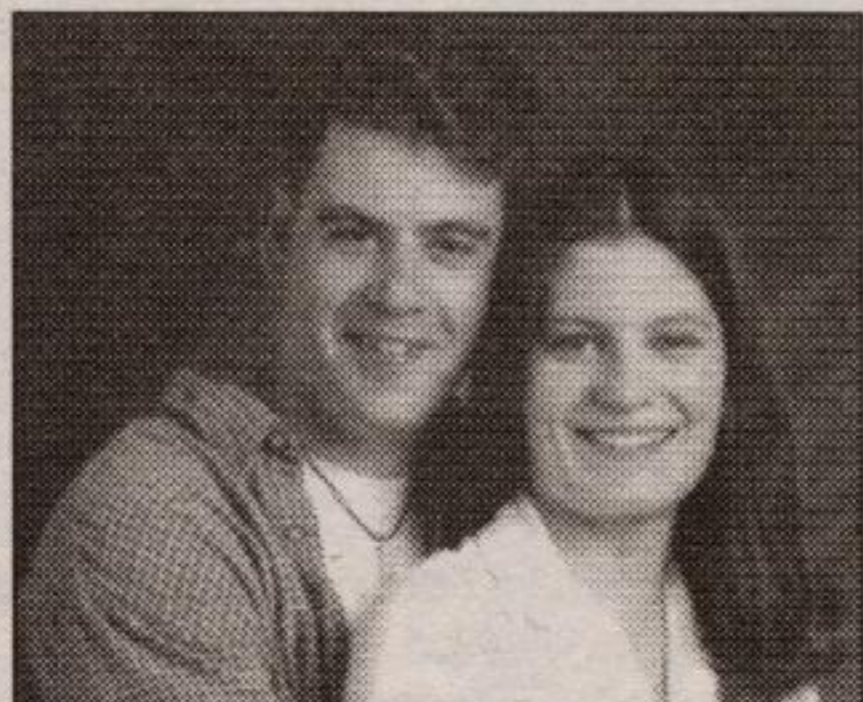

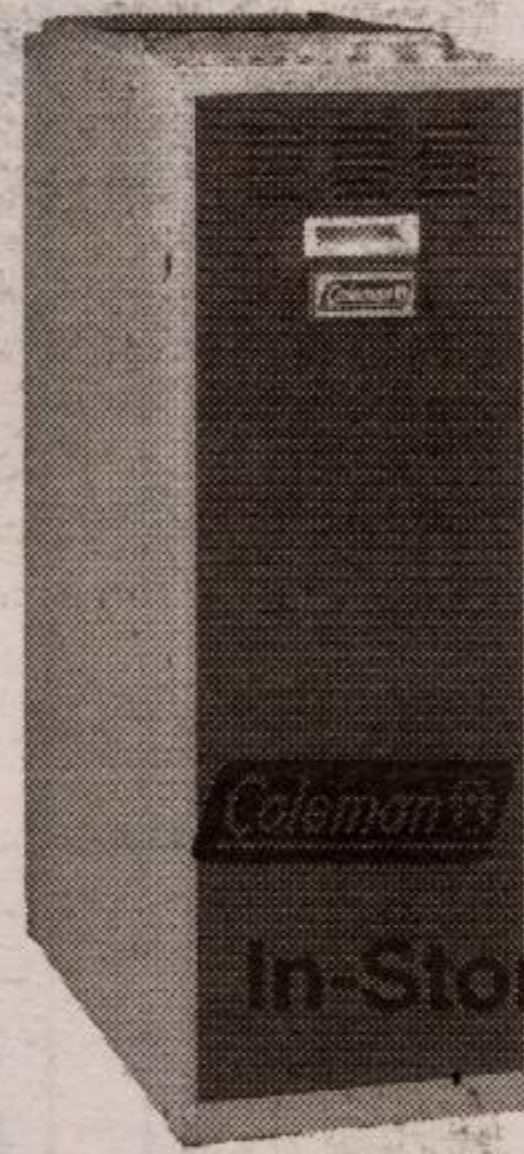
