



# Federal workers stage second of three Wednesday walkouts

Human Resource Centre in Georgetown joined other federal civil servants who walked off the job Wednesday.

The employees, members of Local 631 of the Public Service Alliance of Canada, took to the sidewalk in front of the Guelph St. office in the second of three walkouts scheduled for this month.

They have been without a contract since June 2000 and are seeking an annual wage hike of 5 per cent over the next two years. The government is offering a wage increase of 2 per cent each year for three years.

The employees also want an improvement in working conditions.

Strike captain Maggie Wilkinson said eight staff members from the Georgetown office walked off the job, and one employee from the centre was designated to remain in the office.


They carried signs emblazoned with, "We ask for fair treatment, no more, no less," "MPs 20.6 per cent, senior executives 8.7 per cent and workers 2 per cent," and handed out flyers to the public.

The local employees were joined by Petro Canada employees who have been on strike since April, and civil servants from other areas.

They plan to walk off the job again next Wednesday and if they don't get a decent offer Wilkinson said there could be a full strike in September.

Halton Police told The Independent & Free Press they were called to the picket line Wednesday to ensure picket line guidelines were being followed.
