Local teenagers on dream flight caught in U.S. day of tragedy

plane carrying a load of children and adolescents, including two teens from Halton Hills, hoping to enjoy their first visit to Disney World, had their dreams dashed by Tuesday's terrorist attacks in the United States.

SkyService Flight 426, which departed Hamilton's John C. Munro International Airport Tuesday morning, passed over the Washington D.C. area around 9 a.m., about the same time the terrorist campaign started.

The special charter flight was headed to Orlando, Fla. with 95 children aged 6-19. The youths and teenagers, who have severe physical disabilities or life-threatening illnesses, were anticipating fun in the sun and meetings with Mickey ' Mouse, Goofy and Donald Duck through the Sunshine Dreams For Kids Dreamlift event.

Instead, their once-in-a-lifetime trip was cancelled as Disney World and its older sister, Disneyland in California, were both closed at noon in reaction to the plane crashes into the World Trade Centre in New York City and the Pentagon in Washington D.C.

Car found in Acton may be linked to death of Belwood man

car found in Acton Sunday evening is undergoing forensic testing to determine if it was involved in the death of a Belwood man who was found unconscious on the 9th Line of Erin Township early Sunday.

Initially, County of Wellington OPP investigators believed Matthew James Virgin, 19, was the victim of a hit and run accident, however, after further investigation they are treating the death as a homicide.


Virgin was taken to Georgetown Hospital and later transferred to Hamilton General Hospital where he died Monday.

Detective Staff Sgt. Frank Young said police removed a blue four-door car from a Cook St. address Sunday evening and are awaiting results of tests being done at the OPP Forensic Identification Unit in Orillia to determine if it had anything to do with Virgin's death

Young said he didn't believe the registered owner of the car was from Acton.

A post mortem was done Tuesday to determine the cause of death.
