

The brainchild of the late Ron Hill, who died in July, the concept allows new directors and actors to take to the stage, and in doing so, give an eclectic array of plays to the audience packed in one night of entertainment.

Opening the festival was Eggheads, a comedic study in how a story can be embellished with every telling. The story opens with Gwyneth and her friend Amiga discussing how Gwyneth has scored exceptionally high on a recent IQ test, and has been identified as gifted. She refers to herself as an egghead.

By the time the story makes a full circle to Gwyneth again, she has died of an egg-sized brain tumour, and was destined to go directly from Grade 8 into college.

Cast members include Larry Scott, Shirley Scott, Ron Hunt, David York and Ro Palumbo-Coates, as they demonstrate how gullible a human being can be.

The one act festival is a unique approach, utilizing similar sets throughout all four plays, yet in very different settings. A' departure from the regular plays GLT usually produces, the one act festival expands the group's repertoire, and in doing so, gives it's audience a change of pace.
