The Halton Islamic Association plans to match the regular collection money raised this week and send the funds to an appropriate relief organization in New York City.

Tuesday's American tragedy was also noted Wednesday night at a Halton District School Board meeting. The board has lowered flags at its schools.

"We join many people with our thoughts and heartfelt sympathy towards those affected by the U.S. tragedy," said board chair Ethel Gardiner. "We can't begin to imagine the loss that's being felt."

Both Halton boards have provided information to teachers on how to speak to students about the attacks in the U.S. and have their tragic events response team members at the ready to go into the schools if needed. The Halton District Board has also sent tips home to parents on how to explain Tuesday's events to their kids.

Two local teens, Samuel and Alexis Palmiere, were unable to fly home from a Sunshine Dreams for Kids Dreamlift to Walt Disney World Tuesday as a result of the attacks.

They were expected to fly home yesterday (Thursday) afternoon.

Many area residents are eager to reach out and help their American neighbours in the aftermath of Tuesday's events, and there are several ways they can do that locally:


