Women charged in knifepoint robbery of local restaurant owner

Two women are facing charges after the owner of Ming's Place Restaurant on L Guelph St. was robbed at knife-point early Wednesday.

Halton Police report about 1:40 a.m. two women, one brandishing a knife, entered the restaurant and demanded money from the owner, a 54-year-old Brampton man. Police say one of the women was known to the owner.

The women forced the man into the women's washroom where he received a cut on the hand. They took his money and alcohol from the bar then fled on foot.

Members of the Halton Police Service's Tactical Rescue Unit and canine unit responded and searched the area. A short time later the suspects were found at Brucewood Rd. and Guelph St. attempting to hail a taxi cab.

The restaurant owner was taken to Georgetown Hospital where he received stitches, then was released.

Charged with robbery and uttering death threats are Monica Mitchell, 24, of no fixed address and Anna Rocha, 29, of no fixed address.

Board asking parents to promote tolerance
