Georgetown Little Theatre set to begin 41st season

Do you enjoy live theatre but shudder at the high cost of tickets, not to mention parking, in Toronto?

Did you know you can enjoy excellent live theatre right here in Georgetown for under \$20 per ticket, not to mention the free parking?

That's right, you need go no further than the John Elliott Theatre where Georgetown Little Theatre (GLT) is set to present its 41st season of quality, live entertainment.

The 2001-02 series kicks off in November with *Romantic Comedy* by Bernard Slade, which enjoyed a long run on Broadway starring Anthony Perkins and Mia Farrow and was also a feature film starring Dudley Moore and Mary Steenburgen.

Rehearsals for *Romantic Comedy* are already under way.

The plot revolves around the arrogant, self centred, yet successful Broadway playwright, Jason Carmichael (played by Mark Tiller) who is facing two momentous events; he's about to marry a society belle (Julia Guthrie) and his collaborator of many years has left to write screenplays. Enter Phoebe Craddock (Elizabeth Barfoot), a mousy Vermont schoolteacher and budding playwright, and Jason acquires a talented and adoring collaborator. Fame and success are theirs for 10 years before

Jason's world falls apart as his wife divorces him and Phoebe, her love for Jason unrequited, marries and moves to Paris. Just when Jason is at his lowest, re-enters a now chic and successful-in-her-own-right Phoebe.

Romantic Comedy is directed by Gina DenRaalte and the cast includes Pat Ball, Laura Kosmaci and Mike Tadic.

In February, be prepared to chase away the winter blues with the rollicking English farce, *Out of Order* by Ray Cooney, directed by GLT veteran Ron Hunt.

When Richard Willey, a Government Junior Minister, plans to spend the evening with one of the Opposition's typists, things go disastrously wrong, beginning with the discovery of a "body" trapped in their hotel room's window. Desperately trying to get out of this sticky situation, Richard enlists the aid of his Parliamentary secre-

tary, George, but naturally they end up sinking further into trouble. Things go from bad to worse with the addition of a nosy hotel manager, an unscrupulous waiter, a distraught husband, Richard's wife, not to mention that pesky "body"! This is one play that will leave the audience helpless with laughter!

Rounding out the season in April is the murder/mystery *Silver Dagger* by renowned Canadian playwright, David French.

The protagonist of this gripping new thriller is mystery writer Steve Marsh. Soon after his third novel is published, Marsh's wife receives a series of phone calls and letters that threaten to destroy their marriage. Adultery, blackmail, murder—and a figure lurking in the rain. All these classic elements of Marsh's fiction become a part of his life.

Silver Dagger will be directed by GLT founding member, Vera Macdonald.

All shows are presented at the John Elliott Theatre, 9 Church Street, all seats are reserved and the curtain time for all shows is 8 p.m. The theatre is wheelchair accessible. Ticket prices are \$15 for Wednesdays and Thursdays and \$18 for Fridays and Saturdays.
