





Big Band sound swings on Oct. 20

he Halton Museum Foundation's popular fund-raising Hearthside Music Series continues on Saturday, Oct. 20 at 8 p.m. with sound of the Big Band era.

The Whitney Smith Big Steam Band is a 17-piece jazz and swing band which delivers a driving, energetic, straight-ahead performance, not unlike the style of the great Count Basie and Duke Ellington orchestras of the 1950s and 1960s.

The sound is solid swinging jazz mixed in with some hot Latin and sultry rhythm 'n' blues, a spicy combination that gives the Big Steam Band its unique crossover sound.

Cal Dodd, known for his extraordinary vocal range, is the featured vocalist for the

evening's performance at the John Elliott Theatre, (Halton Hills Cultural Centre), 9 Church Street, Georgetown.

Hosted by the Halton Museum Foundation, in association with AM740 Prime Time Radio and Lawlor & Company Marketing and Communications, this is a fund-raising event for the museum's building fund.
