Not enough residents interested in idea

Glen Williams heritage designation proposal put on the shelf

proposal to designate a portion of Glen Williams as a heritage district has been put on the shelf where it will collect dust until more residents become interested in the concept.

Halton Hills council accepted the recommendation by the Glen Williams steering com-

mittee at its meeting Monday.

The issue became so divisive in the community last spring that Halton Hills council voted to create a steering committee to consider the matter further. The committee was composed of six residents who were either involved in developing the proposal or impacted by it, plus council members.

Committee member Michael James who last spring was emphatic about his distaste for the proposal, urged council to accept the withdrawal.

Mayor Kathy Gastle, who chaired the committee and is a heritage advocate, said she couldn't support the designation when five of the 10 homeowners who own 'A' heritage

homes opposed the district. These are the most historic homes.

"It'll be sitting on a shelf ready to go and I hope it won't be too long before we see it back before council," the mayor said.

Councillor Joan Robson, a Glen resident, encouraged owners of heritage homes to

have them designated individually.

"Perhaps in so doing there might be greater interest in the community at a later date," she said, "but at this point it certainly falls far short of a meaningful number of those interested."


