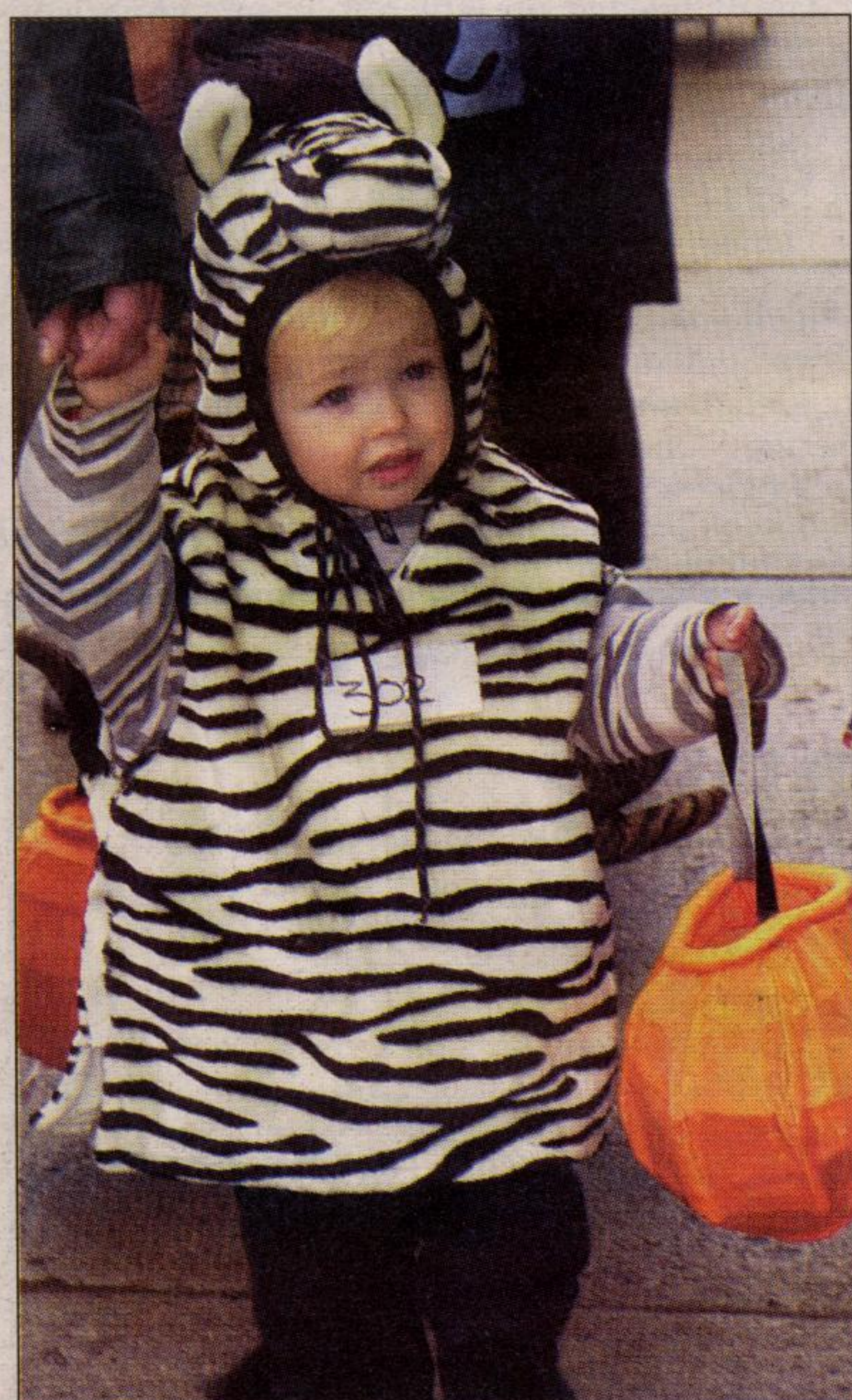

Follow these Halloween tips tonight

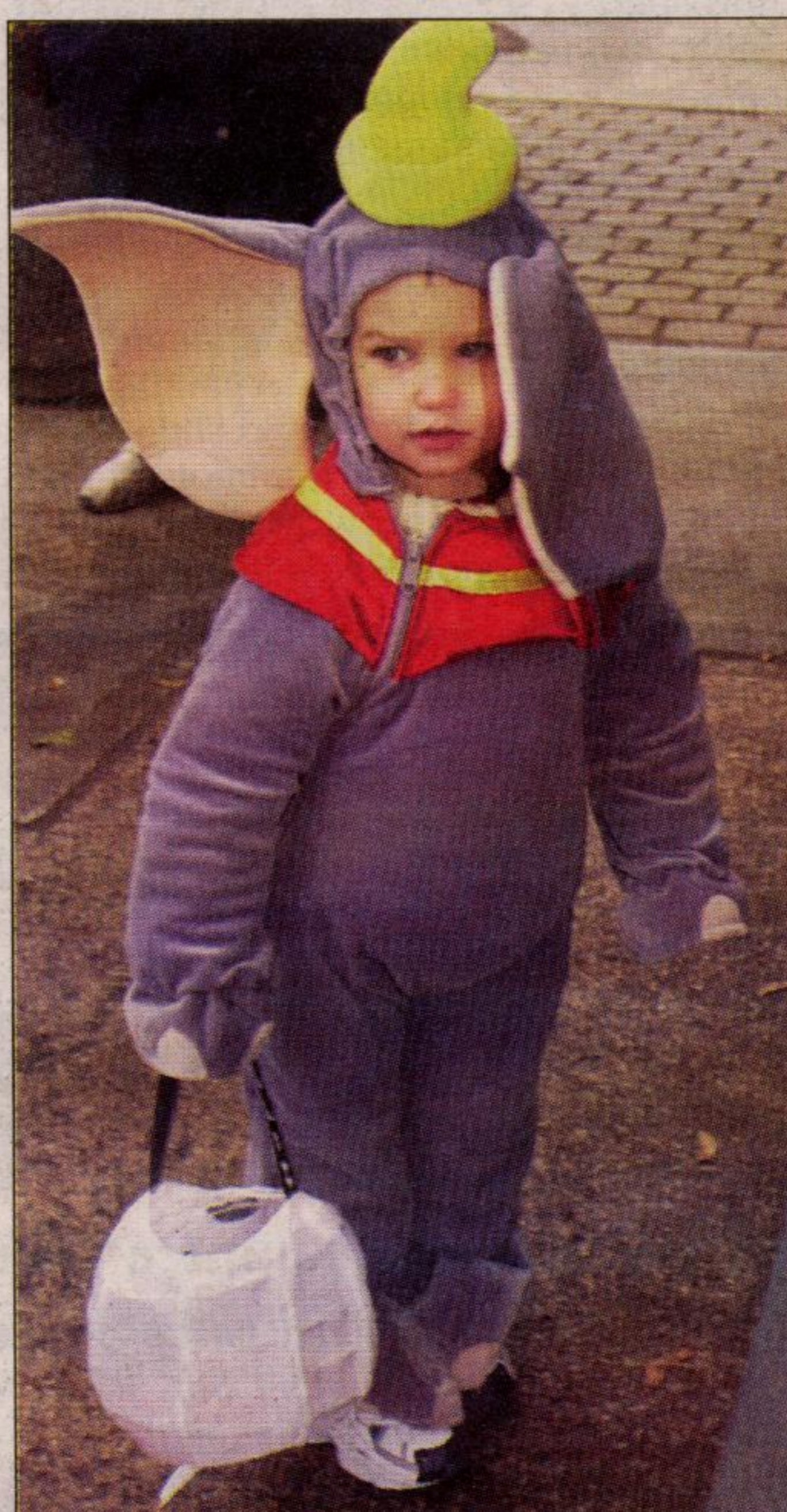
To ensure a safe and happy Halloween for area children Halton Regional Police offer several safety tips.

- When picking out a costume it should be bright and reflective and short enough that you don't trip on it.
- Masks can limit or block eyesight, consideration should be given to using non-toxic makeup and decorative hats as a safer alternative.
- Use flashlights and ensure they have fresh batteries, both for the kids and escorts.
- You should discuss what is appropriate and inappropriate behaviour.
- Stay in groups and always let someone know where you are going.
- A parent or adult should escort smaller children.
- Older children should let their parents know the route that they will be taking and set a time they should be back.
- Only go to homes that have a porch light on. Never go into a home or a car to get a treat.
- Stay on well lit streets and never cut across lawns or use alleys.
- Stay on sidewalks and if there are no sidewalks walk on the farthest edge of the roadway facing traffic.
- Don't assume that if one vehicle stops for you that all the others will, sometimes motorists have trouble seeing Trick or Treaters.
- Don't eat any treat until they have been thoroughly checked by your parents or an adult. Try and have the children eat a good meal before they go out as this will help to deter them from snacking.
- Obstacles should be removed from lawns and steps to prevent children from being injured.
