After recovering from that "thrill" we opted for an easier target— an old car in an empty



"What the hell do you think you're doing." I wheeled around to look directly into the navel of the largest man I ever met.


Frozen with fear, the car's owner made Splash and I remove the soap with the clothes we were wearing—not an easy feat.
