

Redmen hold off Lord Elgin to reach volleyball semifinals

espite having defeated Lord Elgin in two straight games two weeks ago, Acton Redmen junior boys volleyball coach Lori Herteis wasn't about to take anything for granted.

"It's so unpredictable," Herteis said.
"We've had a lot of close games this year and anyone can beat any team."

Acton, which finished the season 4-4, found out how unpredictable things can be as they advanced to the semifinals on Thursday. Acton rallied for a 27-25 victory in the first game then had to hold off a Lord Elgin comeback for a 25-22 win to seal the match.

The Redmen found themselves in an early 7-2 hole against Lord Elgin. Though they were having trouble establishing their own offence, they managed to chip away at the lead because of their strong defensive play.

After building its early lead, Lord Elgin was never able to score more than a single point off service. Acton put together a five-point run to for a 20-18 advantage but Lord Elgin regained the lead and was serving for the win (24-23) before the Redmen came back to tie and then win the game.


Game two saw Acton jump out to an early 13-4 lead as their attack came together.

"It took us a little while to get the playoff jitters out of the way," said Herteis.

Though Lord Elgin closed the gap, Acton looked to be in control at 22-16. However, Lord Elgin refused to give in and scored four points while facing match point before Acton finally prevailed.

"Over the course of the year they've worked hard in practice," Herteis said. "They've had good passing which leads to a strong attack and their positioning defensively— they've worked on coverage a lot."

Acton hoped to have both those elements working for them heading into


