

Rebels roll over Pearson

The Georgetown District High School Rebels' late-season scare appears to have refocused the defending senior boys provincial champs.

The Rebels lost to Nelson late in the season— their first loss in league play in more than two years— but they came out firing on all cylinders in Tuesday's Halton volleyball quarterfinal. The Rebels defeated Pearson with relative ease 25-7, 25-16. In the opening game, Pearson only managed to score a single point off its own serve.

"Other than the odd rally mistake we made, they didn't score," said Rebel coach Jonas Kaciulis.

Limiting those mistakes will be the key to how far the Rebels, currently ranked fifth in the province, will go. In a recent tournament they dominated second-ranked Francis Liberman in the second game of their match, winning 25-8.

"The third game came back to mistakes. The team that makes the least will win," Kaciulis said. In this case, it was Liberman triumphing.

The Rebels have also adjusted their offence to try to give themselves better hitting opportunities.

"We want to make their best player move," Jonas Kaciulis said. "If we can create one-on-one blocking, we're going to be tough to beat."

The Rebels played in the semifinal Thursday (yesterday). A win would advance them to Monday's Halton final at Sheridan College in Oakville.

Nicholls paces Rebels' win

Krista Nicholls ended her high school basketball career in impressive fashion, scoring 31 points to lead the Georgetown Rebels to a 43-34 win over Acton on Tuesday's senior girls basketball season finale.

Holly Goddard led Acton with 15 points while Meghann Williams had 13.

A 6-2 run by Acton in the second quarter cut Georgetown's lead to 17-14 at the half. The Rebels increased their lead to 31-24 in the third. Acton outscored the Rebels 13-12 in the final quarter but couldn't take advantage of its foul shots to close the gap further.

In the junior game, Georgetown jumped out to an 11-2 first quarter lead and went on to a 34-14 victory. Acton struggled with injury troubles. Four players were hurt, including both captains going out with sprained ankles. April Thomas was Acton's top scorer with six points.

Clark DeGeer and Jeremy Wick each scored twice as Halton Minor Peeewe Hurricanes tied Welland 4-4. Curtis Renaud and Jeff Pierce each had a pair of assists with singles to David Dunbar and Ian Smith.

Josh Dewar and Wick scored in Halton's 2-2 draw with Grey-Bruce. Earlier, Jason Church had the lone goal in a 3-1 loss to Stoney Creek.

Minor Peeewe Raiders

Alex Bortolotto turned aside 46 shots to steal a 3-1 victory for the McMaster Meats and Deli Raiders against Oakville. The Raiders got goals from Reid Parker, Kyle Lockwood with the winner late in the second, and Blake Seaton. Jessie Modzelewski had a pair of assists with singles to Craig Syme, Seaton, Michael Parker and Byron Hackett.

Burlington scored on a breakaway with three seconds to play to edge the Raiders 3-2. Seaton and Eric Cruikshank scored to give the Raiders a 2-1 lead.

**ADJUSTING TO NEW DENTURES
FEEL**

At first your new dentures might feel very large in your mouth. You may even experience a gag reaction. This is normal in the beginning. In time, with a little patience and practice, you will adjust naturally to this initial fullness and barely notice it in your mouth.

SPEECH

Many new denture wearers have difficulty at first with their speech. Words containing "S" sounds can be a problem. Practicing speech aloud with your new dentures in place will help restore your normal speaking quality. Try reading aloud from a book or magazine in front of the mirror. This will help you to get used to the new speaking position of your tongue and new denture. This will also give you more confidence. Also, before you speak, it is helpful to first bite and swallow. This will "set" the dentures in position and improve clarity.

EXCESS SALIVA

When you first receive your new dentures, you will probably notice an increase in the flow of saliva in your mouth. This is a normal response to the unfamiliar new denture. On the average, most people swallow about 600 times a day. For the first few days after receiving your new teeth, you should try to swallow more frequently. After a few days have passed, your mouth will become used to the denture, and saliva flow will return to normal.
