

Naturalists earn Excellence Award

Halton/North Peel Naturalists Club and its counterparts South Peel Naturalists Club and Upper Credit Field Naturalists have jointly received the Credit Valley Conservation's Award of Excellence.

The three groups were able to complete a series of reports for the CVC including the Credit Watershed Bird Species of Interest, the Fish, Mammals, Reptiles and Amphibians, and Vascular Plants. This resulted in 244 birds, 65 fish, 41 mammals, 13 reptiles, 19 amphibians, 102 trees, 110 shrubs, 19 vines and 958 herbaceous plants being listed, including some previously unknown to the CVC.

Additional work by the group resulted in a short list of 110 birds of Conservation Concern.

A runner up to the Excellence Award and receiving an Award of Distinction instead was Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources (POWER). This Halton Hills-based group has been working on projects in the Niagara Escarpment, Sixteen Mile Creek and Fairy Lake to involve students in the restoration and environmental education activities, school yard naturalization projects, teacher training and other support.


