on to them. It was time to go kettle shopping. I like to think of myself as an open-minded individual and certainly technically inclined.


But I wasn't at all prepared for the onslaught of information I had to wade through to buy a damned tea kettle.

Will that be Orange Pekoe? English Breakfast? Or how about a spot of Earl Grey?


