Viewing for the event, to be held at the Region of Halton Administration Building, 1151 Bronte Rd., Oakville, begins at 12:30 p.m. with the auction starting at 1 p.m.

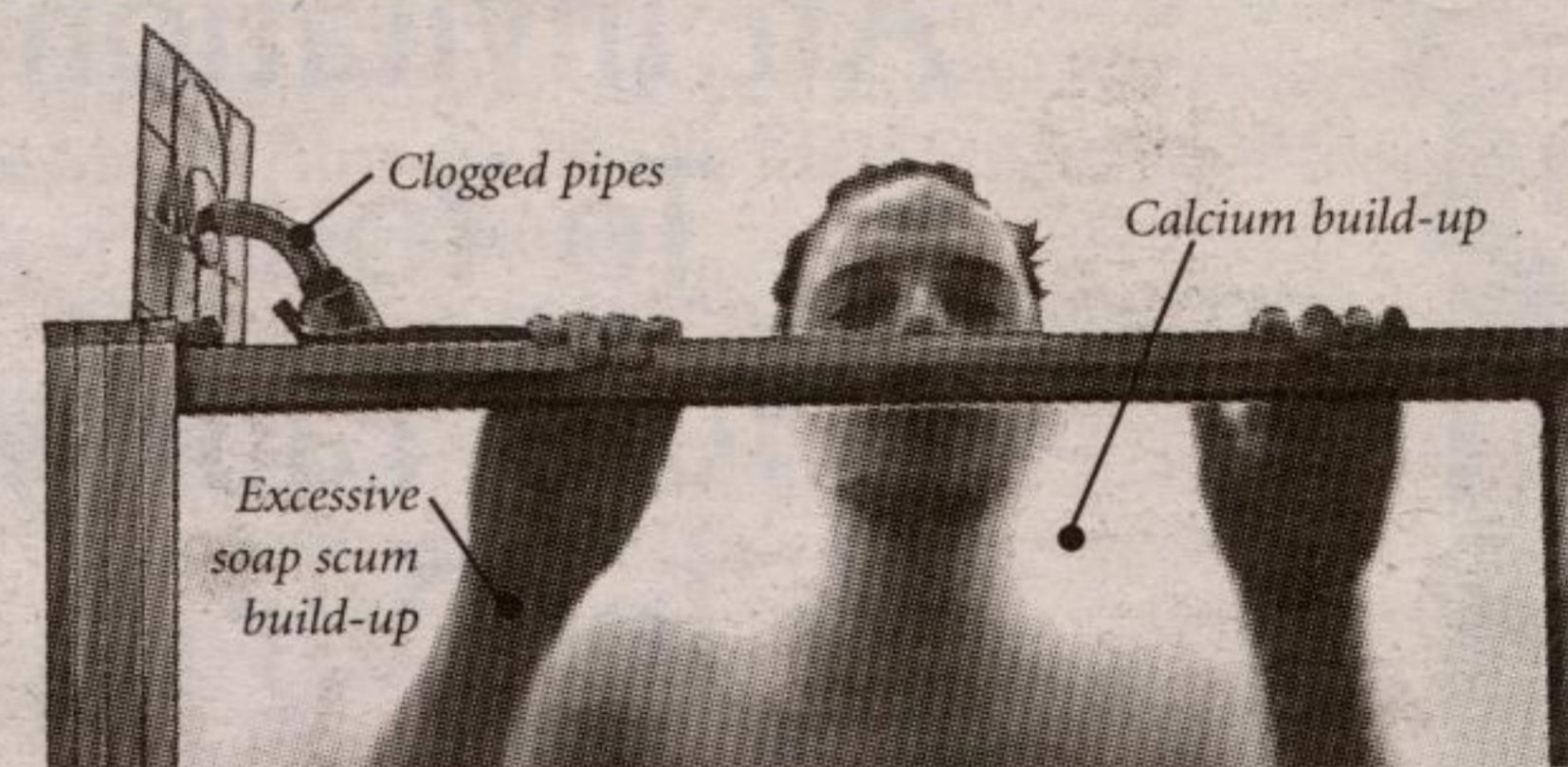
