# SOR critical of town land deal

(This letter was sent to Mayor Kathy Gastle and members of Halton Hills council. A copy was made available for publication.)

Mayor Gastle and members of council, Re: Hungry Hollow ravine OMB case.

It was with profound disappointment that Save Our Ravines— Halton Hills (SOR) learned of the town's recent agreement with the developer to settle the Hungry Hollow ravine case before the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB). The Hungry Hollow ravine represents some of the last green space in urban Georgetown and if the town's settlement were accepted by the OMB, approximately 150 houses would be constructed in the valley.

Members of the SOR were shocked and dismayed that town council would take such a step without consulting, in any way, with the community. SOR and the community at large, have dedicated countless hours on a volunteer basis in support of the town's previous position against development in the valley.

This support across the community has been serious, committed and sustained over a prolonged period of time— approximately three years. We had been given assurances on more than one occasion in the past that the town would never agree to any settlement without the input of our group.

While we take no position on the town's settlement of its lawsuit related to the old option agreement with the developer, SOR objects, on the strongest terms, to council's

secretive, closed doors settlement of the OMB matter.

We are now in the process of deciding how to proceed from here. The town has put the community in a very difficult position of having to either accept housing in the valley or somehow take on a full-time role at the hearing. This is considerably different than the part-time role previously contemplated by SOR in support of the town.

We will be consulting with the community at a meeting we have scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Dec. 5 (at the Salvation Army Church on Mountainview Rd., south side of the Hungry Hollow bridge) and we will make a decision after we receive that input.

We wanted council to be aware of the extent of our group's utter disappointment with council's decision not to consult with the community before settling the OMB

However, with a view to moving forward, we now urge council to consider alternative ways by which to save this part of the valley— whether it be by land swap, density bonusing, purchase or by other means. Please show leadership on this important issue and be assured that SOR, and we believe the entire community, are still prepared to work with you towards finding that solution.




