




Impact ended their run with the strong defence and balanced team effort they showed throughout the tournament, winning 25-19,


Rebels to host boys' basketball tourney this weekend


The Georgetown District High School Rebels will be at 7:30 p.m. will host the Tip-Off Classic Against Cancer boys basketball tournament this weekend.
