

Charity hair-cutting turns bizarre

Police would like to talk to man seen near bag of braids that disappeared

n overwhelmingly positive experience for a George-Ltown woman who shaved her head to raise money for The Hospital for Sick Children has turned ugly.

The young woman who raised \$11,700 for the hospital's oncology unit Monday was also planning to donate the hair she had shorn to make a wig for a child who is going through chemotherapy treatments, but to her horror, her two 40-inch braids have been stolen.

After checking with friends about the whereabouts of the hair and having Nashville North searched from


top to bottom, Angie Akers called COGECO Cable to get a copy of the videotape of the event.


Akers said she felt sick when she viewed the tape and saw a man, who was at the event, with his hand on the bag of hair, which Akers said could be worth between \$1,000 and \$5,000.

The camera pans away for a second or two and when it returns to where the man was standing, he's seen leaving and the bag of hair is gone. .

"I was gagging," said Akers. "It turned my stomach completely." Akers said the man, who took

Port Credit OPP say the accident involved a southbound Toyota Tercel driven by Craig Banks, 34, of Acton, and a northbound Honda Civic driven by Kim Su Min, 33, of Brampton. Banks was airlifted to Sunnybrook Hospital, and a family member said Thursday afternoon he was undergoing surgery for hip, pelvic and other internal injuries.
