# Theft of hair cut for charity leaves woman feeling 'ill'

North with a digital camera that night, told some of her friends he was a photographer with *The Toronto Sun* newspaper.

Toronto Sun assistant city editor Sheila Regan said the man is not an employee of the newspaper.

"He was not a Sun photographer," said Regan. "We are doing our own investigation and take it very seriously when someone says they work for us and they do not."

Akers said the man took several pictures of the backs of her friends' heads, and asked for their e-mail addresses so he could send them copies of the photos.

"It makes me feel ill because he's not just a hair thief, he's creepy," said Akers.

"It's so disturbing. What disturbs me the most is he was very active all night. He has e-mail addresses of at least 20 girls I know of," said Akers.

She then issued a warning to her friends: "If he tries to contact you, please don't meet him."

Akers stressed she shaved her head for a reason.

"It felt good to know that it (the hair) was going to be worn by someone who needs it," she said.

After viewing the tape, Akers reported the incident to Halton Police. Detective Sgt. Don Cousens said Thursday they are investigating it as a theft.

"It's a very unusual and pathetic occurrence," said Cousens, who added he hasn't come across another one like it in his lengthy career.



Halton Police are interested in talking to this man, seen in a COGECO videotape taken at Monday's charity haircutting event at Nashville North.


"Halton Police are interested in talking with anyone in attendance at the function who would have any knowledge as to the disappearance of the hair, including this individual in this picture," said Cousens.


