Church to hold Good Friday service in Tenebrae tradition

The Good Friday service at the Georgetown Christian Reformed Church will be done in the Tenebrae tradition on March 29 at 10 a.m.

Tenebrae is a form of service that has been practised by some churches since medieval times, Pastor Mark Verbruggen said.

At the hour-long service readers will recall the events that led Jesus to the cross and candles will be extinguished one by one, dramatizing the death of Jesus.

For this service, the church windows will be darkened and as worship continues the diminishing light symbolizes the fading devotion of the disciples and the darkness that came at Jesus' crucifixion.

Towards the end of the service only a single candle— considered a symbol of our Lord— will remain and then be extinguished. Finally, a loud noise will be heard, marking the earthquake at the time of Christ's death and his resurrection. The light of the Christ candle will then be restored to show the triumph of good over evil.

At the conclusion of the service the congregation will leave the church in silence but return at 10 a.m. on Easter Sunday (March 31) to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

The Georgetown Christian Reformed Church has a congregation of 600 and is located on Trafalgar Rd., north of Maple Ave. next to Georgetown District Christian School.

In January the annual congregational meeting voted to begin a \$1.5 million building expansion subject to \$500,000 being raised first. A progress announcement is scheduled for April 21.
