Minor Novice Tanners win 1-0 thriller to capture OMHA championship title

The Acton Carquest Minor Novice Tanners touched off a day of cele-L bration, bringing Acton its first of two Ontario Minor Hockey Association championships on Saturday.

Jesse Harris held the Caledon shooters at bay and Roger Kirkness' second-period goal was the difference as the Tanners edged Caledon 1-0. The victory gave them a three games to one series victory.

"I told the kids that in the last 25 years only seven Acton teams had won (an OMHA championship)," said Tanners' coach Bruce Chiasson. "We're number eight so that's something for them to be really proud of."

Although the Tanners' previous two victories in the series were by convincing scores of 4-0 and 6-1, they kept their fans on the end of their seats right to the end on Saturday.

After a scoreless first period, the Tanners finally opened the scoring with 6:38 to play in the second. Roger Kirkness took a pass from James Begg and slipped the puck past a Caledon defender to create a two-on-one break. Kirkness held on to the puck and beat the goalie with a shot to the glove side for his sixth goal of the series.

Later in the period, Acton looked to extend its lead when Jesse Spurrell sent Kirkness in alone but the Caledon goalie turned him away.

In the third, it was Caledon, with its season on the line, that applied the pressure. Even though it kept the puck in the Acton end for much of the period, the Tanners allowed few good scoring chances.

"They were outplaying us but they were not getting any good quality chances," Chiasson said. "I still felt confident. I thought we'd be OK."

Even when Caledon did get its chances, Harris was there to turn them away. With less than nine minutes to play, the puck went to Caledon's Nicholas Geiser, who was alone in the slot. Geiser's shot caught Harris going the wrong way as he moved across to face the shooter but he managed to reach back with his blocker to deflect the shot wide.

With three minutes left, Harris came up with a great glove save at close range to keep his team ahead.

From there the defence kept Caledon from mounting any strong attacks.
