Mayor says criteria needed for projects

who was absent at last week's meeting, about the missing report, Gastle replied, "It's still floating out there... Probably because you weren't here, staff thought it would be wise if it waited until you returned. In the meantime I decided we needed a joint partnership policy that's fair to everybody."

Gastle gave notice that she will introduce a motion at the April 8 general committee meeting calling for a town committee to prepare a joint funding policy establishing criteria for community-based projects on town-owned or leased lands.

Gastle said there is a need for a criteria for town contributions of capital funds for community-based projects more than \$10,000.

"This council has already established a desire to support partnerships," the mayor said. "Recently with the Jubilee Bridge and the controversy that ensued around it, we have to demonstrate fairness to all our citi-

zens across the town. I've been extremely proud of citizen leaders who recognize that they can contribute in creative and innovative ways to enhance our town with results that cost the taxpayers less."

She cited recent examples of joint partnerships (public and private dollars) such as Georgetown Fairgrounds horseshoe pits, Cedarvale Park lights, Georgetown Skateboard Park, revitalization of Willow Park Ecology Centre and the Adopt-A-Flowerbed program. She added there have been many other projects that have not been measured in terms of staff time.

Her motion, she said, would treat all citizens proposals on an equal playing field.

However, Johnson still wanted to know the status of the bridge report. Gastle referred to staff for an answer.

"It's not high on our priority list at this point," said Acting Director of Recreation and Parks Henry Tse.

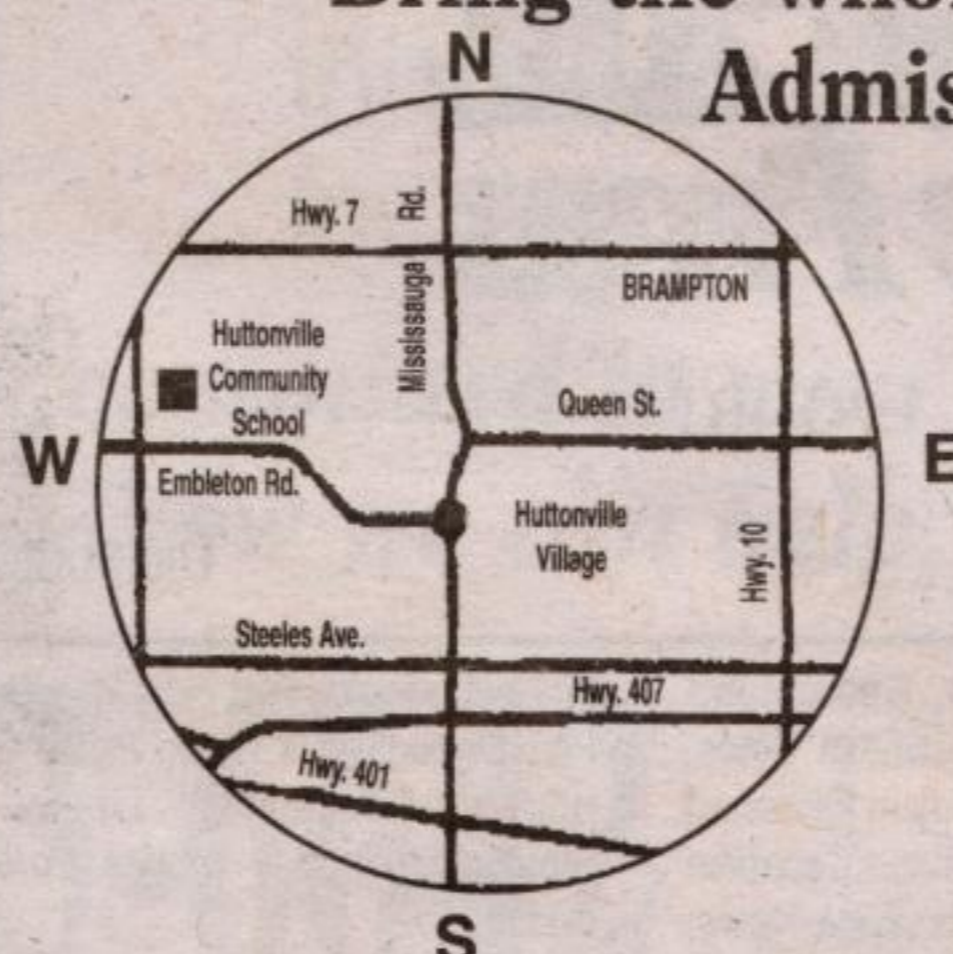
