Rotary clubs join forces to raise money for Halton Women's Place

The Rotary Clubs of Georgetown and Acton have committed to raise \$50,000 for Halton Women's Place.

Halton Women's Place recently held a sod-turning event starting the construction of a new residence in Milton to serve north Halton (Acton, Georgetown and Milton). The residence provides emergency shelter to women and children in abusive environments.

Halton Women's Place has been successful in raising 85 per cent of the \$3 million goal through fund-raising and grants but still requires a final \$500,000 to meet the matching grant criteria. Rotary clubs throughout

Halton Region will play a key role in achieving this target. The Rotary Clubs of Acton, Milton and Georgetown have committed to raise \$50,000 of the total contributions required.

The money will be raised through the sale of 1,000 Colorado Blue Spruce planting trees. The trees are being donated by Georgetown resident, Doug Young, from his 15 Sideroad farm. They will range in size from 4-9 ft and will sell for \$75-\$125 each, wrapped in burlap and wire baskets for immediate planting.

Trees will be on sale from Rotary members during the month of April, at locations throughout Georgetown, Acton and Milton. Orders can be

"This is an exciting and gratifying undertaking" said Brian Herner, president of the Rotary Club of Georgetown. "The results of this program will help to provide a wonderful new safe harbour facility for our community. Purchasers of the trees obtain a high quality product to beautify their environment and the benefit is put back into the community."

The new facility, located on the Allendale campus in Milton, replaces the existing building which has become unsafe and inadequate. It is expected to open in October.

The following few tips, if followed correctly, will prolong the benefits and enjoyment of better hearing:


- Do not get the hearing aid wet
