The club, which has been active in the Halton Hills area for the past dozen years, is part of the North American Shrine fraternity which supports 18 orthopedic hospitals, three burn hospitals and one hospital that provides orthopedic, burn and spinal cord injury care. The hospitals are located in both the United States and Canada and to date more than 65,000 children have been helped— at no cost to parents— since the first Shriners Hospital opened in 1922.



Tooth Chatter



DENTURE CLEANING TIPS:

*Fill the sink halfway with water so your dentures won't break if you drop them.

*Scrub dentures thoroughly. Ask your denturist for a special denture brush; it's short bristles clean sides and chewing surfaces and long bristles reach the narrow spaces inside. Soap and water work fine: baking soda removes stains. Lavedent denture cleanser is an excellent cleaner, and is available at our office.

*If you have partial dentures, clean their metal clasp carefully.

*If you find denture brushes hard to handle, try a nail brush for a better grip.

*Rinse dentures in clean water before returning them to your mouth.

*Remember to keep in touch with your denturist. Your mouth changes constantly - so from time to time, your dentures will need adjusting to maintain a good, comfortable fit. While reviewing the fit, your denturist will also examine your tissues, and review your home - care routine.
