

In Twisters Day of Champs Horton's wins novice title

Tim Horton's goalie Kendra McCutcheon was tough to beat all season and proved to be equally stingy in the playoffs.

McCutcheon, the team's MVP, posted her third straight shutout but still needed to come up with a little more to help her team claim the novice championship with a 2-0 shootout victory over Sunrise Acres.

McCutcheon was matched by her Sunrise Acres counterpart Alyssa Cartman, who also earned team MVP honours, as they battled through three scoreless periods and then a scoreless overtime.

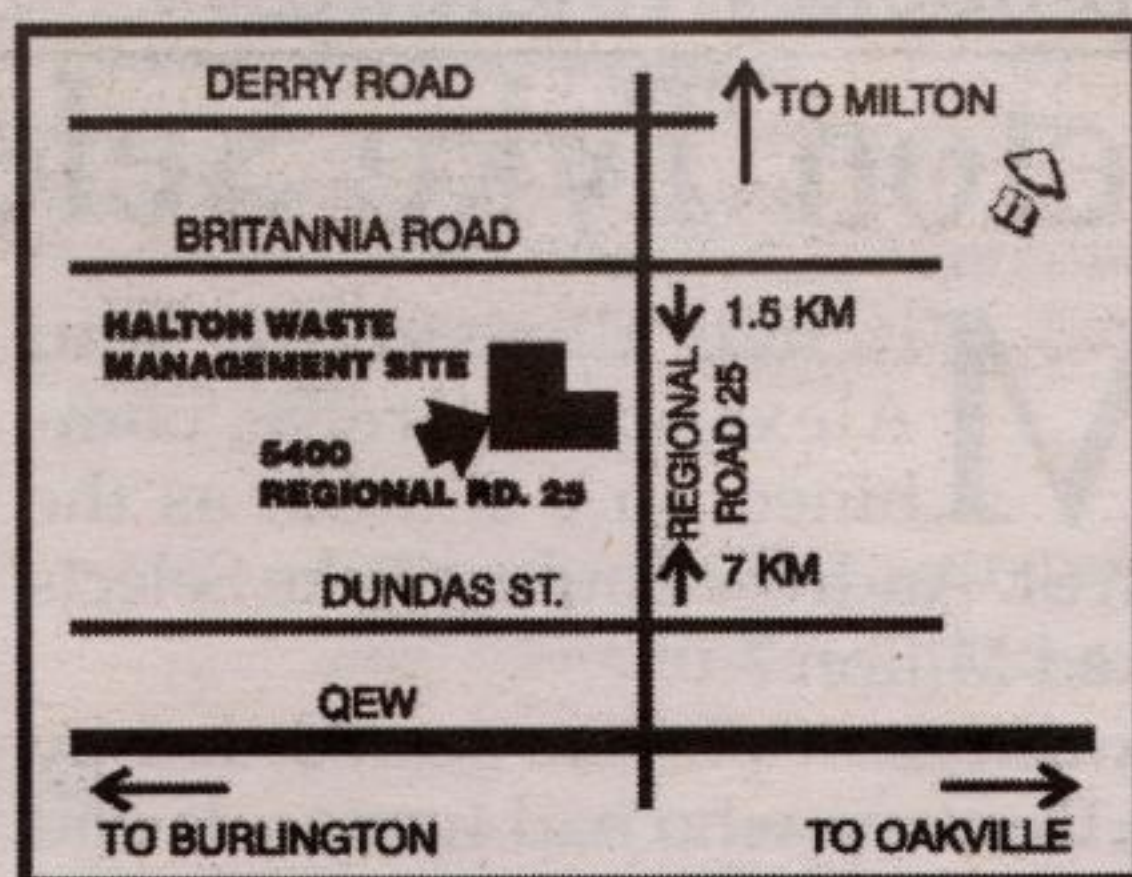
