Musical opens May 2

Anything Goes for Globe as rehearsals get under way

Georgetown Globe Production is in rehearsal for the Cole Porter musical, *Anything Goes*.

The show opens Thursday, May 2 at the John Elliott Theatre (JET). This is a revival of Globe's 1982 production that marked its first show at the JET. It also celebrates 20 consecutive years of Globe musicals.

Show-stopping dance and music numbers such as *You're the Top* and *Blow Gabriel Blow* are contrasted with ballads such as *All Through the Night* and *I Get a Kick Out of You*.

The plot centres on a group of passengers on board a ocean liner from New York to London in the 1930s. Billy Crocker sneaks

on board the ship to be near his lost love Hope Harcourt, but Hope is engaged to a titled Englishman.

Also on board is an evangelist-turned nightclub singer Reno Sweeney, along with her four "angels". Added to the mix is public enemy #13 Moon-Face Martin and his moll, Bonnie.

The show is fast-paced and under the experienced direction of Brigida Callaghan, choreographer Gord Murray, and musical director Marilyn Willis.

The show runs May 2-4, 8-11 at 8 p.m. with a 2 p.m. matinee on May 5. Ticket prices are \$15 and \$17. Call the box office at 905-877-3700.

Missa Gaiawas an experience to remember

For those who packed Holy Cross Church both Thursday and Friday night to experience Georgetown Choral Society's rendition of Missa Gaia, it would be fair to say most left the performance in awe.

The eclectic musical mass, celebrating Earth and Creator was unlike any other material Georgetown Choral Society had performed, as it incorporated not only a wide range of musical styles, but also an audio visual display that featured projected images of wildlife, fauna, landscapes and people adding another dimension to the musical presentation.

Sound effects of howling wolves and solitary whales were echoed by vocals and instruments, as the images simultaneously flashed on the screens.

Toronto-based soloist Alana Bridgewater, with her strong alto vocals, gave the presentation its focus, while the choir filled in the gaps spanning some wide divides of music, from a

deep Gregorian Chant, to the light almost childlike, *For the Beauty of the Earth*, performed by Georgetown Children's Chorus.

Co-composer Paul Halley handled piano and organ duties, while musical director Dale Wood kept the choir and Bridgewater in sync.

Following both shows, the audience was entertained in Holy Cross hall at a reception.
